# *Preface*

*The National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO) has been carrying out all-India household surveys on employment and unemployment with a large sample usually once in five years. The sixth such survey was conducted in the 55<sup>th</sup> round (July 1999 – June 2000) and this report features the key results. It contains three Sections and two Appendices. Of these, Section 1 is introductory while Section 2 deals with the concepts and definitions of important terms used in the survey and which are relevant to this report. Section 3 discusses the key results of the survey and their comparison with results of the previous surveys.*

*Appendix A presents the detailed tables and Appendix B discusses the Sample Design and Estimation Procedure used for the survey.*

*The schedule of enquiry for the survey is broadly similar to that adopted in previous quinquennial rounds. The Field Operations Division (FOD) of the Organisation conducted the fieldwork for the survey. The collected data were processed and tabulated by the Data Processing Division (DPD) of the NSSO. The Survey Design & Research Division (SDRD) of the NSSO developed the survey design and prepared the report. I am grateful to the Chairman and members of the Governing Council and Heads of various Divisions of the NSSO and their colleagues for the contribution made in preparing the report.*

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# Section 1

## Introduction

### 1. The report in perspective

1.1 An all-India survey on the situation of employment and unemployment in India during the period July,1999-June,2000 was carried out as part of the 55<sup>th</sup> round of the National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO). In this survey, a nation-wide enquiry was conducted to provide estimates on various characteristics pertaining to employment and unemployment in India and some characteristics associated with them at the national and state levels. In this survey, information on various facets of employment and unemployment in India were collected through a schedule of enquiry (schedule 10). A sub-set of sample households were revisited after a gap of three months, and an abridged form of schedule 10, viz. schedule 10.1, comprising the main items of enquiry of schedule 10 was canvassed for these households. A few important estimates pertaining to some key employment-unemployment characteristics based on the data collected during the entire round have been presented in this report.

### 2. Background

2.1 One of the important surveys conducted by the NSSO is the quinquennial survey on employment-unemployment. The first such survey was done during September 1972-October 1973 corresponding to the 27<sup>th</sup> round of NSSO. The present survey is the sixth in the series.

2.2 *Past Surveys:* To assess the volume and structure of employment and unemployment, starting with the 9<sup>th</sup> round (May-September,1955), NSSO conducted a number of surveys on employment and unemployment. To give a firm conceptual framework for conducting such surveys, the Planning Commission, in the year 1970, set up an “Expert Committee on unemployment estimates”, (popularly known as the Dantwala Committee), which reviewed these surveys and the indicators generated from such surveys. Based on concepts and definitions recommended by this committee, the first quinquennial survey on employment and unemployment was conducted in the 27<sup>th</sup> round of NSS. Since then, four quinquennial comprehensive surveys on employment and unemployment situation in India have been carried out by the NSSO, in which concepts and procedures were based primarily on the recommendations of the Dantwala Committee. These four surveys were conducted during the 32<sup>nd</sup> round (July,1977-June,1978), 38<sup>th</sup> round (January,1983-December,1983), 43<sup>rd</sup> round (July,1987-June,1988) and 50<sup>th</sup> round (July,1993-June,1994), respectively.

2.3 *Other surveys on employment-unemployment:* Apart from these five quinquennial surveys on employment and unemployment, NSSO have been regularly collecting information on certain key items on employment and unemployment from a limited set of households in each round since its 45<sup>th</sup> round (July,1989-June,1990) through the schedule on Household Consumer Expenditure (Schedule 1.0). These are on the usual and current weekly status employment and unemployment, category of employment, industrial distribution of the usually employed etc. The results of such surveys have been published up to the 54<sup>th</sup> round (January-June,1998).

2.4 *The present survey*: In the present survey, information on some new items and additional information on some items that were canvassed in earlier rounds have been collected. This has been done following the suggestion made by the Working Group set up to finalise the survey methodology and schedules of enquiry of the 55<sup>th</sup> round. Some of the more important among such changes, which have enlarged the scope of the survey and could have a bearing on the estimates, are stated below:

a) In the schedule of enquiry, while the past practice was to record the details for *only one* subsidiary usual economic activity of all the members of the household, in this round, details of *two* subsidiary usual economic activities pursued by them for relatively more time were recorded.

b) In this round, for the first time in the employment-unemployment schedule, certain probing questions were asked to the usual status workers to identify the size of employment in the non-agricultural unincorporated enterprises (i.e., the proprietary and partnership enterprises other than those covered under Annual Survey of Industries (ASI)), along with some other characteristics of those enterprises, where such workers were employed.

Further, departing from the past practice of canvassing schedule 10 and schedule 1.0 (household consumer expenditure) on the same set of households, in this round, these two schedules of enquiry were canvassed on two separate sets of households.

### 3. Scope

3.1 *Items of enquiry*: As in the past, in the present survey too, NSSO collected data on some characteristics, based on which, estimates of employment and unemployment, measured in terms of 3 basic approaches viz. usual status, current weekly status and current daily status can be obtained. The reference period for these approaches differ - it being 365 days preceding the date of survey for "usual status", 7 days preceding the date of survey for "current weekly status" and each day of the 7 days preceding the date of survey for "current daily status".

3.2 Data were collected on the activity status of all persons, i.e. for workers, for those seeking or available for work and also for those remaining out of labour force. A worker could be self-employed or enjoy regular salaries/wages or be employed on casual wage basis. Data on this aspect, along with the industry of work of the worker and his/her occupation, were collected during this survey. Data were also collected regarding non-agricultural workers (i.e. those working in an industry other than agriculture and related activities like hunting, forestry, logging and fishing) by their activity status, location of work place, type of enterprises where they work and some other characteristics. Such detailed data for non-agricultural workers were collected for the first time in this survey.

3.3 It is proposed to bring out several detailed reports on various items of inquiry separately, at a later date. For the present report, since only the key results on employment and unemployment are presented here, discussion is limited to only those items which have been used to generate the estimates presented herein. The detailed explanation of each of these items is given separately in section 2 ('Concepts and Definitions').

3.4 *Geographical Coverage*: The survey covered the whole of the Indian Union excepting (i) Ladakh & Kargil districts of Jammu and Kashmir, (ii) 768 interior villages of Nagaland situated beyond 5 kms. of the bus route and (iii) 172 villages of Andaman & Nicobar Islands which remain inaccessible throughout the year. A few other areas of Jammu & Kashmir were also excluded from the survey coverage owing to unfavourable field conditions.

#### **4. The survey in brief**

4.1. *Method of data collection*: The survey used the interview method of data collection from a sample of randomly selected households. The sample design on the basis of which such selection was made is stated in brief in the following sub-section.

4.2 *Period of survey and work programme*: The fieldwork of 55<sup>th</sup> round of NSSO started from 1<sup>st</sup> July, 1999 and continued till 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2000. As usual, the survey period of this round was divided into four sub-rounds, each with a duration of three months, the 1<sup>st</sup> sub-round period ranging from July to September, 1999, the 2<sup>nd</sup> sub-round period from October to December 1999 and so on. Equal number of sample FSU's was allotted for survey in each of these four sub-rounds. Each FSU was surveyed during the sub-round period to which it was allotted. Within a particular sub-round, the fieldwork was spread out uniformly over different weeks/months to the extent possible.

#### **5. Sample design**

5.1 *An outline of the sampling design*: The sampling design adopted for the survey was essentially a stratified multi-stage one for both rural and urban areas. The first stage units (FSUs) were villages (panchayat wards for Kerala) for rural areas and NSS Urban Frame Survey (UFS) blocks for urban areas. The ultimate stage units (USUs) were households. The procedure for selection of fsus/usus are given in detail in Appendix B to this report. Large FSUs were subdivided into hamlet groups (rural)/sub-blocks (urban). Details of the formation of hamlet group/sub-blocks and procedure of selection of households are also given in Appendix B.

5.2 *Sampling Frame for FSUs*: The list of villages (panchayat wards for Kerala) as per 1991 Census and latest lists of UFS blocks of NSSO were respectively used for selection of rural and urban sample FSUs. For selection of sample villages from the State of Jammu & Kashmir, the list of villages as per 1981 Census was used as the sampling frame. Moreover, all the uninhabited villages of the country as per 1991 Census, interior villages of Nagaland situated beyond 5 kms. of a bus route and inaccessible villages of Andaman & Nicobar Islands were left out of the survey coverage of the NSS 55<sup>th</sup> round.

5.3 *Sample Size – first stage units*: A total number of 10,384 FSUs (6,208 villages and 4,176 urban blocks) was selected for survey in the central sample at the all-India level in the 55<sup>th</sup> round for canvassing schedule 10. Sample size for the whole round for each State/UT x Sector (i.e. rural/urban) was allocated equally among the 4 sub-rounds. Sample FSU's for each sub-round were selected afresh in the form of 2 independent sub-samples. Thus, there were 8 such sub-samples. In addition, 3894 FSUs – 1298 in each of the sub-rounds 2, 3 and 4, corresponding to sub-samples 1, 3 and 5 - were re-visited for canvassing schedule 10.1.

5.4. *Sample size – second stage units*: For schedule 10, in each of the eight sub-samples, from each selected village in rural areas and from each selected urban block in urban areas, a sample of 12 households were surveyed. Apart from this, in the 3 re-visited sub-samples, viz. sub-samples 1, 3 and 5, the abridged schedule 10, viz. schedule 10.1, was canvassed during the re-visit to the same set of households. In addition, in these re-visited sub-samples, from among the newly formed households found during the re-visit of a FSU, at most 1 household was surveyed from each of the two segments and only schedule 10 was canvassed in those households. In the central sample, the actual number of persons surveyed was 5,09,779 in the rural sector and 3,09,234 in the urban sector.

## **6. Contents of the Report**

6.1 As stated earlier, this report deals with key estimates on Employment and Unemployment obtained from tables generated on data collected on specified items for the entire round. As such, all discussions in this report are limited to only those items/concepts, based on which such estimates have been generated.

6.2 This report contains three sections, including the present introductory section, and two appendices. Section 2 states in detail the concepts and definitions of only those terms used in the survey in connection with the various items on which key estimates have been generated. Section 3 discusses some important findings on certain key features of the employment-unemployment situation in India and related aspects. The detailed tables based on which this report is brought out are presented in the Appendix A. Appendix B gives a fairly detailed description of the sample design and estimation procedure used for the survey.

6.3 *Tables in Appendix*: Appendix A of the report contains ten tables. Of these, four (tables numbered 1 to 4) provide various estimates on employment and unemployment following different approaches of measuring them while two others (tables numbered 8 and 9) provide some measure/indicator of underemployment. Of the remaining four tables, two (tables numbered 5 and 6) provide estimates by broad industry division of workers, another (table numbered 7) presents estimates of employed persons by their general education status while the fourth one (table numbered 10) gives figures on average wage-rates of casual workers.

6.4 All the estimates presented in this report are based on Central sample data only. Further, the cell-level figures in any of the detailed tables, when added up, may not exactly equal the figure shown against the “total” column (or line) due to (i) rounding off and/or (ii) presence of non-response cases.

## Section 2

### Concepts and Definitions

1.0 The concepts and definitions of some important terms used in the survey and which are relevant to this report viz., those used to generate the tables and key estimates on employment-unemployment are explained in the following paragraphs.

1.1 **Household:** A group of persons who normally lived together and took food from a common kitchen constituted a household. The adverb “normally” means that temporary visitors were excluded but temporary stay-aways were included. Thus a child residing in a hostel for studies was excluded from the household of his/her parents, but a resident employee or a resident domestic servant or paying guest (but not just a tenant in the house) was included in the employer/host’s household. “Living together” was given more importance than “sharing food from a common kitchen” in drawing the boundaries of a household in case the two criteria were in conflict. However, in the special case of a person taking food with his family but sleeping elsewhere (say, in a shop or a different house) due to space shortage, the household formed by such a person’s family members was taken to include the person also. Each inmate of a hotel, mess, boarding-lodging house, hostel, etc., was considered to be a single-member household except that a family living in a hotel (say) was considered one household only. The same principle was applicable for the residential staff of such establishments.

1.2 **Economic activity:** Any activity resulting in production of goods and services that add value to national product was considered as an economic activity. Such activities included production of all goods and services for market, i.e. production for pay or profit, and, the production of primary commodities for own consumption and own account production of fixed assets, among the non-market activities. As in earlier rounds, certain activities like prostitution, begging, smuggling etc., which though fetched earnings, were, by convention, not considered as economic activities.

1.3 **Activity status:** It is the activity situation in which a person was found during a reference period with regard to the person's participation in economic and non-economic activities. According to this, a person could be in one or a combination of the following three broad activity statuses during a reference period:

- (i) working or being engaged in economic activity (work) as defined above,
- (ii) being not engaged in economic activity (work) but either making tangible efforts to seek 'work' or being available for 'work' if the 'work' is available and
- (iii) being not engaged in any economic activity (work) and also not available for 'work'.

Broad activity statuses mentioned in (i) & (ii) above are associated with 'being in labour force' and the last with 'not being in the labour force'. Within the labour force, broad activity status (i) and (ii) were associated with 'employment' and 'unemployment', respectively.

1.3.1 **Categories of activity status:** Identification of each individual into a unique situation could pose a problem when more than one of the three broad activity statuses listed above were concurrently obtained for a person. In such an eventuality, the identification uniquely under any one of the three broad activity statuses was done by adopting *either the major time or priority criterion*. The former was used for classification of persons according to the 'usual activity status' approach



and the latter for classification of persons according to the 'current activity status' approach. Each of the three broad activity statuses was further sub-divided into several detailed activity categories. If a person categorised as engaged in economic/non-economic activity by adopting one of the two criteria mentioned above was found to be pursuing more than one economic/non-economic activity during the reference period, the appropriate detailed activity status code related to the activity in which relatively more time had been spent. The detailed activity categories under each of the three broad activity statuses used in the survey along with the codes assigned to them (in brackets) are stated below:

- (i) situation of working or being engaged in economic activities (employed):
  - (a) worked in household enterprise (self-employed) as own account worker (11);
  - (b) worked in household enterprise (self-employed) as employer (12);
  - (c) worked as helper in household enterprises (unpaid family worker) (21);
  - (d) worked as regular salaried/wage employee (31);
  - (e) worked as casual wage labour (i) in public works (41), (ii) in other types of work (51);
  - (f) had work in household enterprise but did not work due to: (i) sickness (61), (ii) other reasons (62); and
  - (g) had regular salaried/wage employment but did not work due to: (i) sickness (71), (ii) other reasons (72);
- (ii) situation of being not engaged in work but seeking or available for work (unemployed):
  - (a) sought work (81) and
  - (b) did not seek but was available for work (82)
- (iii) situation of being not available for work (not in labour force):
  - (a) attended educational institutions (91);
  - (b) attended domestic duties only (92);
  - (c) attended domestic duties and was also engaged in free collection of goods (vegetables, roots, firewood, cattle-feed etc.) sewing, tailoring, weaving etc. for household use (93);
  - (d) rentiers, pensioners, remittance recipient, etc. (94);
  - (e) not able to work due to disability (95);
  - (f) beggars, prostitutes (96);
  - (g) others (97) and
  - (h) did not work due to sickness (for casual workers only) (98).

**1.4 Workers (or employed):** Persons who were engaged in any economic activity or who, despite their attachment to economic activity, abstained from work for reason of illness, injury or other physical disability, bad weather, festivals, social or religious functions or other contingencies necessitating temporary absence from work, constituted workers. Unpaid helpers who assisted in the operation of an economic activity in the household farm or non-farm activities were also considered as workers. All the workers were assigned one of the detailed activity statuses under the broad activity category 'working' or 'being engaged in economic activity' (or employed).

**1.5 Seeking or available for work (or unemployed):** Persons, who owing to lack of work, had not worked but either sought work through employment exchanges, intermediaries, friends or relatives or by making applications to prospective employers or expressed their willingness or availability for work under the prevailing conditions of work and remuneration, were considered as those who were 'seeking or available for work' (or unemployed).

**1.6 Labour force:** Persons, who, were either 'working' (or employed) or 'seeking or available for work' (or unemployed) constituted the labour force. Persons who were neither 'working' nor

'seeking or available for work' for various reasons during the reference period were considered as 'out of labour force'. The persons under this latter category were students, those engaged in domestic duties, rentiers, pensioners, recipients of remittances, those living on alms, infirm or disabled persons, too young or too old persons, prostitutes, smugglers, etc. and casual labourers not working due to sickness.

**1.7 Self-employed:** Persons who operated their own farm or non-farm enterprises or were engaged independently in a profession or trade on own-account or with one or a few partners were deemed to be self-employed in household enterprises. The essential feature of the self-employed is that they have *autonomy* (i.e., how, where and when to produce) and *economic independence* (i.e., market, scale of operation and money) for carrying out their operation. The fee or remuneration received by them comprised two parts - share of their labour and profit of the enterprise. In other words, their remuneration was determined wholly or mainly by sales or profits of the goods or services which were produced.

**1.7.1 Categories of self-employed persons:** Self-employed persons were categorised as follows:

- (i) **own-account workers:** those self-employed persons who operated their enterprises on their own account or with one or a few partners and who, during the reference period, by and large, ran their enterprise without hiring any labour. They could, however, have had unpaid helpers to assist them in the activity of the enterprise.
- (ii) **employers:** those self-employed persons who worked on their own account or with one or a few partners and, who, by and large, ran their enterprise by hiring labour, and
- (iii) **helpers in household enterprise:** those self-employed persons (mostly family members) who were engaged in their household enterprises, working full or part time and did not receive any regular salary or wages in return for the work performed. They did not run the household enterprise on their own but assisted the related person living in the same household in running the household enterprise.

**1.8 Regular salaried/wage employee:** These were persons who worked in others' farm or non-farm enterprises (both household and non-household) and, in return, received salary or wages on a regular basis (i.e. not on the basis of daily or periodic renewal of work contract). This category included not only persons getting time wage but also persons receiving piece wage or salary and paid apprentices, both full time and part-time.

**1.9 Casual wage labour:** A person who was casually engaged in others' farm or non-farm enterprises (both household and non-household) and, in return, received wages according to the terms of the daily or periodic work contract, was a casual wage labour.

**1.10 Usual activity status:** The usual activity status relates to the activity status of a person during the reference period of 365 days preceding the date of survey. The activity status on which a person spent relatively longer time (i.e. major time criterion) during the 365 days preceding the date of survey is considered as the *principal usual activity status* of the person. To decide the principal usual activity of a person, he/she was first categorised as belonging to the labour force or not during the reference period **on the basis of major time criterion**. Persons thus adjudged as not belonging to the labour force were assigned the broad activity status 'neither working nor available for work'. For persons belonging to the labour force, the broad activity status of either 'working' or 'not working but seeking and/or available for work' was ascertained based on the same criterion viz. relatively longer time spent in accordance with either of the two broad statuses within the labour

force during the 365 days preceding the date of survey. Within the broad activity status so determined, the detailed activity status of a person pursuing more than one such activity was determined once again on the basis of the relatively longer time spent on such activities. In terms of activity codes (stated earlier in para 1.3.1), codes 11-51 were applicable for persons classified as workers, while code 81 was assigned to people either seeking or available for work (unemployed persons) and codes 91-97 for those who were out of labour force.

**1.11 *Subsidiary economic activity status:*** A person whose principal usual status was determined on the basis of the major time criterion could have pursued some economic activity **for a relatively shorter time** (minor time) during the reference period of 365 days preceding the date of survey. The status in which such economic activity was pursued was the subsidiary economic activity status of that person. Thus, activity status codes 11-51 only were applicable for persons reporting some subsidiary economic activity. It may be noted that engagement in work in subsidiary capacity could arise out of the following two situations, viz.

- (i) a person could be engaged for a relatively longer period during the last 365 days in one economic/non-economic activity and for a relatively shorter period in another economic activity, and
- (ii) a person could be pursuing one economic activity/ non-economic activity almost throughout the year in the principal usual activity status and simultaneously pursue another economic activity for a relatively shorter period in a subsidiary capacity.

**1.12 *Number of subsidiary economic activities pursued during last 365 days:*** For persons reporting some subsidiary activity, the number of subsidiary activities pursued by him/her during last 365 days was ascertained and recorded. However, details of a maximum of two such subsidiary economic activities were recorded. The activities having different work status was considered as different activities. Activities within the same work status but with different industry and/or occupation were considered as different activities. If the person was engaged in two or more subsidiary economic activities, the details of the subsidiary economic activity pursued for the maximum time period among all the subsidiary economic activities, or in other words, the major subsidiary economic activity was deemed as 'subsidiary status number I' and the next major one as 'subsidiary status number II' were recorded.

**1.13 *Current weekly activity status:*** The current weekly activity status of a person is the activity status obtaining for a person during a reference period of 7 days preceding the date of survey. It is decided **on the basis of a certain priority cum major time criterion.**

1.13.1 According to the *priority criterion*, the status of 'working' gets priority over the status of 'not working but seeking or available for work' which, in turn, gets priority over the status of 'neither working nor available for work'. A person was considered working (or employed) if he/she, while pursuing any economic activity, had worked for at least one hour on at least one day during the 7 days preceding the date of survey. A person was considered 'seeking or available for work (or unemployed)' if, during the reference week, no economic activity was pursued by the person but he/she made efforts to get work or had been available for work any time during the reference week though not actively seeking work in the belief that no work was available. A person who had neither worked nor was available for work any time during the reference week was considered as engaged in non-economic activities (or not in labour force).

1.13.2 After deciding the *broad current weekly activity status* of a person on the *basis of 'priority' criterion*, the *detailed current activity status* was then decided *on the basis of 'major time' criterion if that person pursued multiple economic activities*. The current weekly activity status of a person

could be any one of the detailed activity status (ref. para 1.3.1) and could have codes 11 to 98. Of these codes, 11 to 72 pertained to workers, 81 to 82 for unemployed and 91 to 98 for persons out of labour force. It may be noted that these are the same as the usual status codes (stated in para 1.10 before) except that codes 61, 62, 71, 72, 82 and 98 are not applicable for usual status and code 81 for usual status is used to indicate both the situations of seeking and being available for work. Further, the current weekly activity status for each individual was based on the *current daily activity status* of that person which concept is discussed next.

1.14 **Current daily activity status:** The activity pattern of the population, particularly in the unorganised sector, is such that during a week, and sometimes, even during a day, a person could pursue more than one activity. Moreover, many people could even undertake both economic and non-economic activities on the same day of a reference week. The current daily activity status for a person was determined on the basis of his/her activity status on each day of the reference week **using a priority-cum-major time criterion** (day to day labour time disposition). Time disposition was recorded for every member of a sample household. This involved recording of different activities pursued by the members along with the time intensity in quantitative terms for each day of the reference week. The different activities were identified and recorded in terms of 'activity status' and 'industry' codes for persons in urban areas and 'activity status', 'industry' and 'operation' codes for persons in rural areas. The terms 'industry' and 'operation' are explained later. The following points were considered for assigning the time intensity and determining the current daily status of a person:

- i) Each day of the reference week was looked upon as comprising either two 'half days' or a 'full' day for assigning the activity status.
- ii) A person was considered 'working' (employed) for the entire day if he/she had worked for 4 hours or more during the day.
- iii) If a person was engaged in more than one of the economic activities for 4 hours or more on a day, he/she was assigned two out of the various economic activities on which he/she devoted relatively longer time on the reference day (for each of those two activities, the intensity was 0.5).
- iv) If the person had worked for 1 hour or more but less than 4 hours he/she was considered 'working' (employed) for half-day and 'seeking or available for work' (unemployed) or 'neither seeking nor available for work' (not in labour force) for the other half of the day depending on whether he was seeking/available for work or not.
- v) If a person was not engaged in any 'work' even for 1 hour on a day but was seeking/available for work even for 4 hours or more, he was considered 'unemployed' for the entire day. But if he was 'seeking/available for work' for more than 1 hour and less than 4 hours only, he was considered 'unemployed' for half day and 'not in labour force' for the other half of the day.
- vi) A person who neither had any 'work' to do nor was available for 'work' even for half a day was considered 'not in labour force' for the entire day and was assigned one or two of the detailed non-economic activity status depending upon the activities pursued during the reference day.

The description (and codes used) of current daily activity statuses are the same as those of current weekly activity status.

1.15 **Industry-occupation:** The description of the industry-occupation was relevant to the type of economic activity pursued by the person. NIC-1998 was followed for classifying industries and NCO-1968 was followed for classifying occupations. In case two or more industry-occupation combinations corresponding to the status code were reported by a person, the principal industry-occupation was taken as the one in which *relatively more time* was spent during the preceding 365 days by the person.

1.16 **Operation**: This was the type of work performed by a person during a reference period e.g. manual, non-manual, agricultural, non-agricultural etc. Operation was combined with activity status and industry corresponding to the work performed. Information regarding the type of operation was collected only for rural areas and relating to current status only. The different types of operations were – ploughing, sowing, transporting, weeding, harvesting, others (manual) and others (non-manual). In the last two cases, the sector in which the work was performed is indicated by the industry. It may be noted that for ‘regular salaried/wage employees’ on leave or on holiday, the ‘operation’ related to their respective function in the work or job from which he/she was temporarily off. Similarly, for persons categorised as ‘self-employed’ but not working on a particular day in spite of having work on that day, the operation related to the work that he/she would have done if he/she had not enjoyed leisure on that day.

## Section 3

### Summary of findings

#### 1. Introduction

1.1.1 As stated earlier in section 1, based on the data collected in the NSSO 55<sup>th</sup> round, the main findings relating to employment and unemployment, including certain characteristics of the employed and trends in employment and unemployment, are presented in this section. The estimates are given for all-India and states and union territories, though the discussion is centered mainly on the all-India estimates. Comparisons are made with earlier survey results for all-India.

1.1.2 A few points on some general aspects of the survey estimates are stated in this para. Compared to the census population or the projections thereof, population estimates from the NSSO surveys are, in general, on the lower side. This difference arises mainly due to the differences in methods and coverage adopted by the NSSO in comparison to the census operation. In this survey, the rural population is estimated as 687 million and urban population as 234 million. However, the ratios obtained from the survey are much closer to the ratios obtained using Census figures. Usually the estimates on employment-unemployment are presented as ratios. To estimate an absolute number in any category, it is advisable to apply the survey estimates of ratios to the census population or projections thereof, for that category. The estimates of aggregates given in the detailed tables help to combine the ratios. It may also be noted that as the tables are generally presented as per thousand distribution, the figures are rounded off. Thus, while using the ratios from the survey results, it is to be noted that the accuracy of these derived aggregates will be limited to the number of significant digits available in the ratio or percentage estimates presented in the report. The estimated aggregates, wherever possible, can be used to get ratios with more significant digits.

1.1.3 The plan of this section is as follows. A sub-section on some population characteristics follow this introductory sub-section. The next two sub-sections deal with the employed at the all-India level and state/ut level respectively. Sub-sections 5 and 6 look into the distribution of the usually employed by their status of employment and by their broad industry groups of work, respectively. Sub-section 7 makes a discussion on the unemployed, while sub-section 8 deals with educated among the employed/unemployed. Sub-section 9 presents the proportion of the unemployed in different states/uts. The last sub-section, viz., sub-section 10, attempts to provide some measure/indicator of the extent of underutilisation of labour time of the usual status workers.

#### 2. Some population characteristics

2.1.1 In this sub-section, we discuss certain survey estimates relating to the population. These are the age distribution of the population and age specific labour force participation rate. These are given for all-India only in this report. The limited number of tables generated for this report do not contain any household tables or other population characteristics.

2.1.2 *Age distribution:* In table 1, the distribution of the rural and the urban population by five year age groups is presented for males and females separately. During the five years separating the present survey from the last quinquennial one, a small shift is visible in the population, especially among the younger age groups. A slight decline in the share of the youngest age group (0-4 years) in all the categories and a little

increase in the share of children aged 5-14 years in rural areas are noticeable. This distribution would help in better understanding of the results presented subsequently, as most of the results are age specific.

2.1.3 *Labour force participation rates(LFPR)*: Labour force refers to the population which supplies the labour and, therefore, includes both the employed and unemployed. For measuring the labour force participation, the usual status (both principal and subsidiary status taken together) concept is discussed here. It includes persons who had worked for some time with some regularity and also those who had either sought work or were available for work for some time. In table 2, the LFPRs for different age groups are given. The corresponding rates based on the last survey are also provided for comparison.

2.1.4 *LFPR during 1999-2000*: Table 2 reveals that during 1999-2000, while 54 per cent of males - in both rural and urban areas - were in labour force, the corresponding percentages for females were 30 in rural areas and 15 in urban areas.

2.1.5 *Change in LFPR between 1993-94 and 1999-2000*: It is seen from Table 2 that, compared to the rates in 1993-94, among rural males, the LFPR has declined in the younger age groups as well as for those aged 50 years and above during 1999-2000. It has remained more or less same for the age groups 25 to 49 years. However, over this period, among rural females, LFPR declined for almost all age groups. In urban areas, the pattern closely resembled that seen for the rural areas. For example, the LFPR for males remained broadly the same for the age groups 25-49 in both rural and urban areas.

### 3. The Workforce

3.1.1 In this sub-section, the estimates of the workforce (or employed) and their structure are discussed. In order to study the trend, earlier survey estimates are provided. The survey has generated three different estimates of the employed based on the three approaches used in classification of the activity statuses of the person surveyed. These are:

- (i) number of persons usually employed - usually employed in the principal status and all workers taking into account the employed according to both the principal and subsidiary statuses,
- (ii) the average number of persons employed in a week based on the current weekly status and
- (iii) the average number of persons-days employed per day.

The number of persons/person-days employed per thousand persons/person-days is referred to as the work-force participation rate (WFPR) or the worker population ratio (WPR). This ratio is used in the following discussions on the employed.

3.1.2 *WFPR estimates*: Of the three approaches, the usual principal status approach is best suited as a measure of the level of economic activity in an economy with seasonal fluctuations in the employment. This is because, in this approach the criteria used is the pattern of activities followed by the person for a relatively long period of time. By considering also persons with some subsidiary employment, certain transient component of employment is also netted in.

3.1.3 Table 3 shows the WFPR during 1999-2000 for all-India population, according to the three approaches, viz., usual status (us), current weekly status (cws) and current daily status (cds), separately. The main points observed from the table are as follows:



- (i) WFPR is higher in rural areas than in the urban areas.
- (ii) WFPR for males is substantially higher than that for females.
- (iii) Among the three approaches measuring the WFPR, the rate according to the usual status including the subsidiary workers i.e. 'all workers' is the highest. Further, WFPR according to cws is higher than that according to cds.
- (iv) Usual subsidiary status employment for females is much higher than for males.
- (v) In case of rural females, the difference between the usual status rate on the one hand and the cws and cds rates on the other, is the widest.

3.1.4 Normally, due to the longer reference period in the usual status, the usual status WFPR should be more stable whereas participation in seasonal activities has an effect on the WFPR according to the cws and cds. The daily status rates take due account of the unutilised days - or even the unutilised half days - of persons who are classified as employed as per the cws or usual status. Thus, the difference between the cds rates and usual status or cws rates is a reflection of the extent of underemployment. This is seen to be higher in the rural sector than in the urban sector. This rural-urban differential could be due to the absence of large-scale regular wage/salaried employment in the rural areas. In fact, in a situation where all persons have full time employment, all the three approaches are expected to produce estimates of same dimension. Thus, the difference among these rates is an indication of the divergence of the employment situation from a situation of zero underemployment.

3.1.5 *Usually employed over the rounds*: Table 4 presents the WFPRs obtained from the present as well as those from the previous quinquennial surveys. It may be noted that due to certain procedural differences for the 27th round WFPR values pertaining to usual status are comparable only with respect to 'all workers', and hence, are presented for that category only. The table shows that, relative to 1993-94, in rural areas, WFPRs for males in 1999-2000 was lower by about 2 percentage points while that for females was lower by about 3 percentage points. In urban areas for males, the rates were at the same level, while for females, the rate was lower by more than 1 percentage point in 1999-2000.

3.1.6 *Current weekly/daily status employed over the rounds*: Table 5 presents the WFPRs obtained from the present as well as the past quinquennial surveys following the cws or cds approach. It is seen from the table that WFPR according to cws was higher than the corresponding rate according to cds in the rounds both in rural and urban areas. Following the cws approach compare to 1993-94, a decrease in WFPR of about 1 per cent for females – in rural or urban areas – and about 2 per cent for rural males, is seen in 1999-2000. However, WFPRs in all the categories are mostly of the same dimension as those observed in the earlier quinquennial surveys. Similar observations hold true when cds approach is adopted.

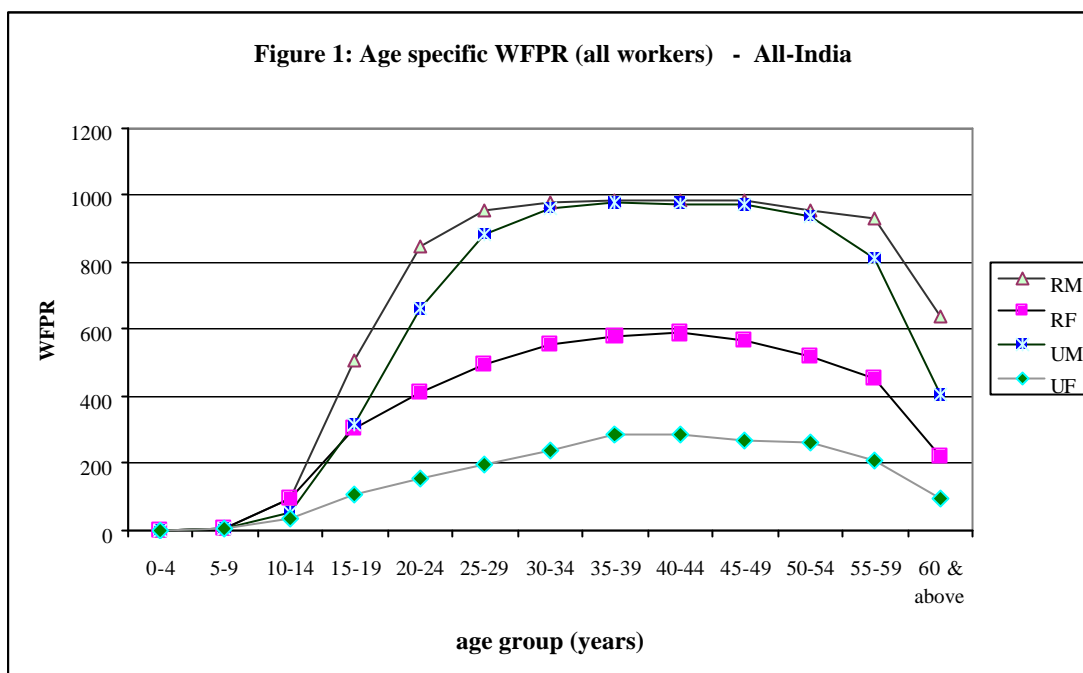

3.1.7 *Age-specific WFPR* : The detailed tables in Appendix A give the WFPRs for 5 yearly age groups according to the three approaches (refer to Appendix table nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4). A chart depicting the age specific WFPR for the all workers category is given in figure 1. It is seen from the figure that a large majority of the male population in the age-group 25-59 years is found working.

#### 4. Work participation rates for States/Uts.

4.1.1 The proportion of employed persons per 1000 persons for different states/uts are given in the following four tables viz. 6, 7, 8 and 9. All of these tables are given by sex and rural-urban residence. While tables 6 and 7 pertain to usual status - table 6 to principal status and table 7 to principal and subsidiary status taken together (i.e. usual status 'all') - tables 8 and 9 pertain to cws and cds respectively. As stated earlier, due to the longer reference period the usual status WFPRs are expected to be more stable. Accordingly, the discussion below is restricted to figures based on table 7, i.e. usual status 'all workers' only.



4.1.2 *Work participation rates for males:* With respect to the states, it is seen that

- (i) in *rural areas*, the highest rate reported is for Andhra Pradesh(605). Two other states with high rates are Karnataka(595) and Tamil Nadu(594). The lowest rates are reported by Haryana(475), Uttar Pradesh(481) and Bihar(492). In the North Eastern region, Manipur reported the lowest(495) and Meghalaya(557) the highest rates.
- (ii) in *urban areas*, high rates for males are reported by West Bengal (567), Tamil Nadu(563) and Kerala(558). Pondicherry(555), Punjab(549) and Karnataka(545) also reported high rates. States like Arunachal Pradesh(399), Bihar(432), Orissa(475) and Jammu & Kashmir(478) reported low rates. In the North Eastern region the lowest participation rates are in Nagaland(393) and Meghalaya(395), and the highest, in Assam(522).

4.1.3 *Work participation rates for females:* These are much lower than those for males in all the states. Other salient features are:

- (i) in *rural areas*, Andhra Pradesh(478) and Himachal Pradesh(471) had reported rates much higher than the other states. Nagaland(441) and Mizoram(440) also had high rates.
- (ii) in *urban areas*, the rates are lower than 250 except for Mizoram(251). Among the major states, only Tamil Nadu(215) and Kerala(203) reported more than 20 % of their urban females as working.

4.1.4 *Changes in the WFPR over the last survey*: In order to look at the change in the participation rates in the major states over the previous survey (i.e. the fifth quinquennial survey), the rates obtained for the current survey and those for the previous survey are presented in the form of four charts in figures 2, 3, 4 & 5. These charts have been prepared considering all workers - i.e. considering principal and subsidiary status together.

4.1.5 It is seen from the charts that in urban areas, compared to 1993-94, during 1999-2000, there has been only marginal changes in WFPR for males in most of the major states. However, the urban female rate was lower in some major states during 1999-2000 than that reported during 1993-94. A situation similar to that observed for urban females is noticed for rural males as well as females. It may be noted that the WFPR estimates are based on sample survey and hence one need not attach too much significance to marginal changes in such estimates.

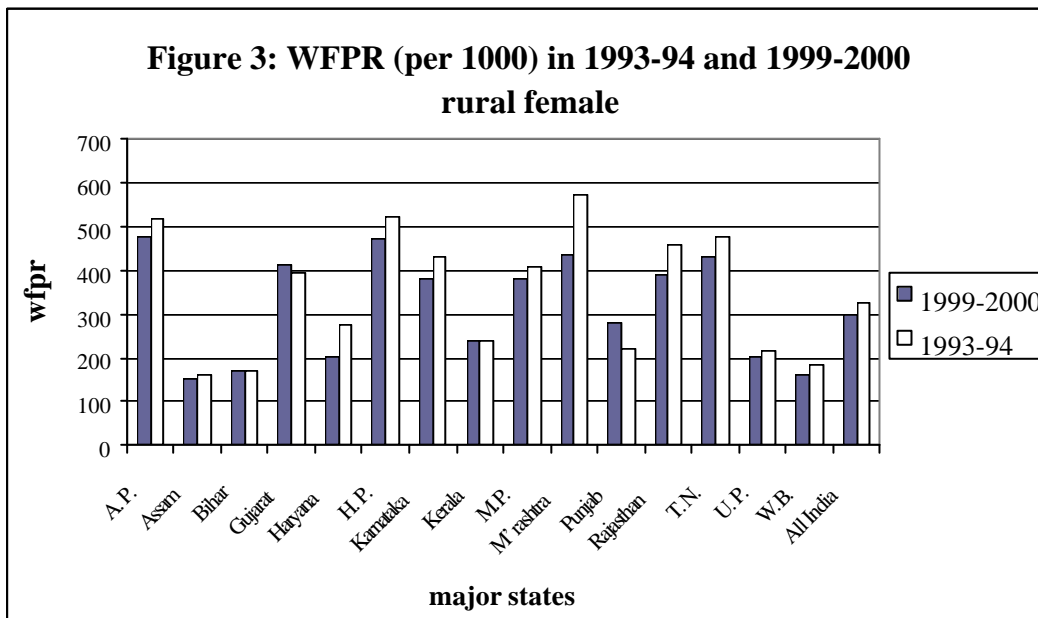
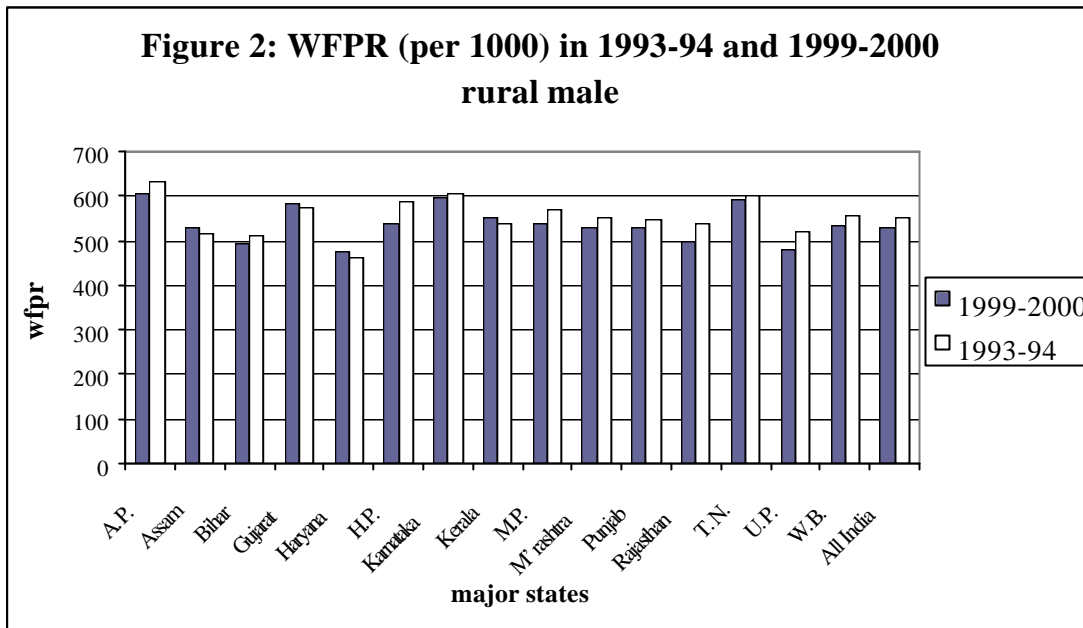
## 5. Usually employed by status of employment

5.1.1 As stated earlier, the employed persons have been categorised in three broad groups according to their status of employment. These groups are (i) *self-employed*, (ii) *regular employees* and (iii) *casual labour*. These groups were formed on the basis of the activity status recorded for each person. Detailed explanation of these categories have been given earlier in section 2. The results obtained from the present survey and earlier ones, pertaining to 'all workers' are presented in table 10.

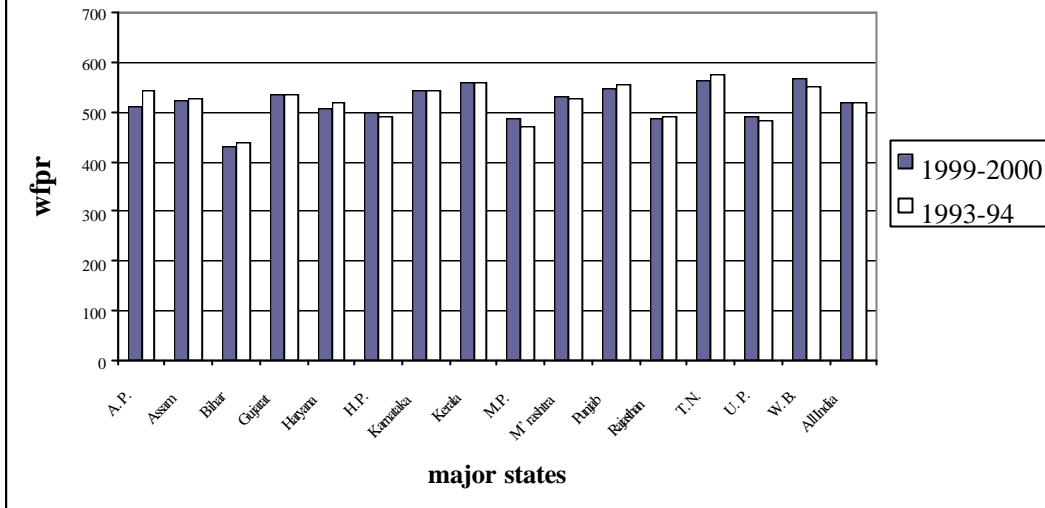
5.1.2 *Rural*: The table shows that, during 1999-2000, *self-employed* accounted for 55% and 57% of the employed males and employed females respectively. About 36% of employed males and 40% of employed females were employed as *casual labour*. Only about 9% of employed males and 3% of employed females were *regular employees*. In fact, it is seen from the table that in all the survey years, *self-employed* were the most, and *regular employees* the least, frequent among the employed – male or female. Further, over the years, the share of the *self-employed* has steadily decreased while that of *casual labour* has steadily increased. However, female *regular employees* constituted about 3 per cent of all employed females throughout the period.

5.1.3 *Urban*: As observed in the rural areas, the employment pattern for males is similar to that for females in urban areas too. However, as expected, the share of *regular employees* is much more in urban areas than in rural areas. During 1999-2000, it was 42% among employed males and 33% among employed females. The share of *self-employed* was quite high, though somewhat lower than that in rural areas. About 42% among urban employed males and 45% among urban employed females were *self-employed*. The share of *casual labourers* was the lowest among urban employed – 17% for males and 21% for females.

5.1.4 *Change over rounds*: Over the years, the share of *regular employees* increased among employed females but decreased a little for employed males. No significant change in share was observed among the other two categories for employed males. Among employed females, during 1999-2000, the share of *casual labour* rose by 5 percentage points after showing a decreasing trend from 1983 to 1993-94.

urban female**

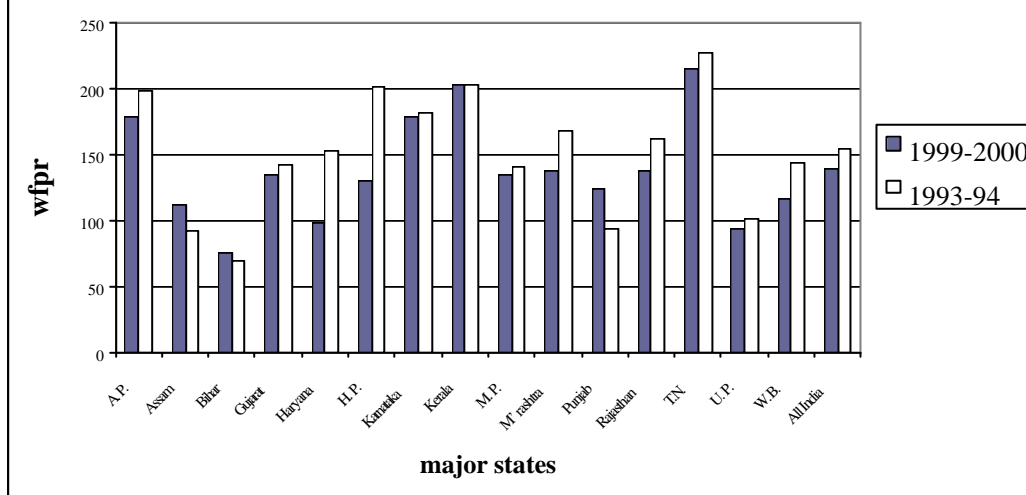

## 6. Usually employed by broad groups of industry

6.1.1 A study of the structure of employment by the broad industry groups of work is attempted in this sub-section. Table 11 gives the per thousand distribution of the usually working by their broad groups of industry of work. For the purpose of the study, the industry divisions (01 – 99) of NIC 1998 have been categorised as (i) *primary* (01-05), (ii) *secondary* (10-45) and *tertiary* (50-99)<sup>1</sup>. As done earlier, the discussion is based on ‘all workers’. It may be mentioned that in NSS 50<sup>th</sup> round NIC 1987 was used while in NSS 43<sup>rd</sup> and 38<sup>th</sup> rounds NIC 1970 was used.

6.1.2 *In rural areas:* The table shows that during 1999-2000, in rural areas, about 71% of male workers and 85% of female workers were employed in the *primary* sector. The *tertiary* sector was a more important source of employment for rural males than for rural females. The *secondary* sector accounted for about 13% of male employment and about 9% of female employment in rural areas.

6.1.3 *In urban areas:* During 1999-2000, for both male and female workers, the *tertiary* sector provided for maximum employment, followed by the *secondary sector*. The share of employment in *primary* sector reported a low 7% for employed females and a little higher - about 15% - for employed males.

6.1.4 *Change over years, rural:* Although the broad pattern in the structure of employment remained the same during the period 1983 to 1999-2000, table 11 shows a decreasing trend in the share of employed in the *primary* sector. While the share of female workers employed in the *tertiary* sector remained virtually stagnant in the range of 5% to 6% during this entire period, the corresponding share for male workers increased from 12% in 1983 to 16% in 1999-2000.

6.1.5 *Change over years, urban:* During the period 1983 to 1999-2000, as seen for rural areas, the pattern of distribution remained broadly the same. However, the share of employment in the *tertiary* sector rose steadily during the period 1983 to 1999-2000 for both males and females. This rise was much higher for females (from 38% in 1983 to 53% in 1999-2000) than for males (from 55% in 1983 to 61% in

1999-2000). During this period the share of employment in the *secondary* sector remained almost static – in the range of 33% to 34% for males and between 29% to 32% for females.

6.1.6 The detailed distributions by industry divisions of the employed according to the usual status taking into account the principal status separately, and the principal and subsidiary status taken together, are given in table 12 for all-India. For all states/uts, the corresponding estimates are available in the detailed tables of Appendix A – Appendix Table 5 and Appendix Table 6 respectively.

## 7. Unemployed

7.1.1 As in the case of employed, for unemployed too, three different estimates are obtained following the three different approaches. These are:

- i) Number of persons usually unemployed based on 'usual status' classification
- ii) Number of persons unemployed on an average in a week based on the 'weekly status' classification and
- iii) Number of person-days unemployed on an average on a day based on 'daily status'.

7.1.2 Of these three, the first estimate indicates the magnitude of persons unemployed for a relatively longer period during a reference period of 365 days and approximates to an indicator relating to the chronically unemployed. However, some of the unemployed obtained on the basis of this time criterion could be working in a subsidiary capacity. We can, therefore, get another estimate of the unemployed excluding those employed in a subsidiary capacity during the reference period. The former is called *the usually*

*unemployed in terms of the principal status (p.s.), and, the latter, the usually unemployed excluding the subsidiary status workers (u.s. adjusted), which would conceptually be lower than the former.*

7.1.3 The second estimate is based on the weekly status and gives the average weekly picture during the survey year. It includes both the chronic unemployment and also the intermittent unemployment caused by seasonal fluctuations in the labour market of those categorised as usually employed.

7.1.4 The third estimate based on the daily status concept gives average volume of unemployment on a day during the survey year. It is the most inclusive rate of *unemployment* capturing three aspects, viz.:

- (a) the unemployed days of the chronically unemployed,
- (b) the unemployed days of the usually employed who become intermittently unemployed during the reference week and
- (c) the unemployed days of those classified as employed according to the priority criterion of current weekly status.

7.1.5 *Unemployment rates*: Unemployment rate is defined as the number of persons unemployed per thousand persons in the *labour force* (which includes both the employed and the unemployed). This, in effect, gives the unutilised portion of the labour force. Thus, it is a more refined indicator of the unemployment situation in a population than the *proportion unemployed*, which is merely the number of the unemployed per thousand persons in the population as a whole. For discussions on the subject of unemployment, the *unemployment rates* are taken up first in this sub-section. *Proportion unemployed* for different states/ uts. are presented in a later sub-section.

7.1.6 *Unemployment rates during 1999-2000*: Table 13 presents the unemployment rates (UR) as obtained from the present survey according to the three approaches. The corresponding proportions unemployed (PU) in the population are given in parentheses. Some of the important points emerging from this table are:

- (i) the overall unemployment rates are not high,
- (ii) the urban rates are higher than the rural rates,
- (iii) the unemployed person-day rates are higher than the rates obtained for persons, thereby indicating a high degree of intermittent unemployment. This is mainly due to the absence of regular employment for many workers,
- (iv) the *usually unemployed*, measured through the usual status or the even more restrictive *usual status adjusted*, as a proportion of the total population, is very small.

7.1.7 However, *unemployment rates* among certain specified categories like the educated, the youth etc. could be higher than these overall rates. Some of these rates as obtained from the present survey are specifically looked into in this paragraph. Considering the population in the age group 15 to 29 who constitute the youth among the labour force, the usual principal status unemployment rates vary from 37 per thousand among rural females to 166 per thousand among urban females. For males, it was 51 per thousand in rural areas and 115 per thousand in urban areas.

7.1.8 Unemployment rates over NSSO survey years: Table 14 gives the unemployment rates according to the six quinquennial surveys of NSSO. It may be recalled that for the 27th round survey only the usual status (adjusted) figures are available. The table shows that compared to 1993-94, during 1999-2000, the unemployment rate in terms of the usual principal status or us (adj.), remained almost the same in rural or urban areas for males and females except for a fall of one percentage point in us (adj.) for urban females. No significant change in these rates in terms of cws is noticeable between the earlier rounds and the present

one. In terms of cds, the rate is higher in 1999-2000 by about one percentage point in rural areas than that obtained in 1993-94, both for males and females. However, for urban females, the rate was lower by one percentage point. However, over the years - from 1983 to 1999-2000 - there is no definite pattern for these rates.

## 8. Employment and level of education

8.1.1 *Educated among the employed/unemployed*: The educational attainment of the members of respondent sample households was ascertained in the survey. The data have been tabulated to obtain the percentage of educated among the employed/unemployed. The educated for this purpose are defined as persons whose educational levels were secondary and above. Only the usual principal status is considered. The results as obtained from this survey are presented in table 15. The table shows that among the *unemployed*, about 57 per cent and 63 per cent reported as *educated* in the rural and urban sectors respectively. The proportion of educated unemployed was higher among females than among males.

8.1.2 The table also shows that, within the category *employed*, the highest proportion of educated was reported among the *regular employed*, in both rural and urban areas. In rural areas, there was a higher proportion of educated among *regular employed* males (47 per cent) than that (39 per cent) reported by the females. On the other hand, in urban areas, there was no male-female differential in this respect, the proportion being 57 per cent. Further, the frequency of educated among *self-employed* was much lower in rural areas (about 14 per cent) than that in urban areas (about 36 per cent).

8.1.3 *Unemployment rates of the educated*: Using table 7 in Appendix A of the present survey results, it is estimated that among the educated people, about 4 to 5 per cent were unemployed. This estimate does not convey the real picture on unemployment as this rate is obtained by taking into account all persons with educational level of secondary and above in the denominator. Many among such people could be continuing their studies as students, or, in the case of females, possibly attending to domestic duties. Thus, in such a context, the *unemployment rate* obtained by considering only those educated people who are included in the labour force in the denominator would be more meaningful. Table 16 presents these rates obtained from the present survey and from the last quinquennial one. To have an idea of these rates among

people with relatively higher educational attainment say, *graduate and above*, the *unemployment rates* corresponding to the category *graduate and above* have also been presented separately in the table.

8.1.4 *Comparison with rates of 1993-94*: Table 16 reveals some interesting facts. In rural or urban areas, the unemployment rate was much higher among educated females than among educated males. During 1999-2000, among educated females in the labour force, these rates were 20 per cent in rural and 16 per cent in urban areas respectively. For males, the rate was just about 7 per cent both in rural and urban areas. Among the *graduates and above*, the difference was even more in the rural areas. As high as 35 per cent of the rural female graduates in the labour force were unemployed as against just 11 per cent of the rural male graduates in the labour force. However, no such gender differential is observed in urban areas. The table also shows that for educated people as a whole, compared to the rates of the NSSO 50<sup>th</sup> round (1993-94), these rates are lower in the present survey - more for females than for males. However, when only *graduates and above* are considered, during 1999-2000, the rate decreased for urban females but increased for rural females.

8.1.5 An attempt has been made to work out the *literacy rates* from the detailed table (Table 7 in appendix A) by considering those members who were not reported as *not literate*. The rates computed are shown in table 17. It is seen from the table that the estimated literacy rate, i.e. number of literates per thousand persons, has increased more for females than for males in the period intervening 1993-94 to 1999-2000. Even among females, the rise was more (by 7 percentage points) in rural areas than that (by 3 percentage points) in urban areas. During 1999-2000, the literacy rate was 550 and 789 per thousand in rural and urban areas respectively. The overall literacy rate was estimated as 612 per thousand.

## 9. Proportion of unemployed in States/Union Territories

9.1.1 The next four tables viz. tables 18 to 21 present the proportion of unemployed (days) per 1000 persons(days) for various states and union territories following the three different approaches stated earlier. While tables 18 and 19 present PU based on us - table 18 for us and table 19 for us adjusted - tables 20 and 21 are based on estimates obtained following cws and cds approaches respectively. All these tables present estimates based on data of the present survey.

9.1.2 *PU's based on us*: To study the pattern of unemployment in the states and uts., one can first consider the usual status unemployed. They consist of persons who have reported unemployment for a relatively longer time during the reference period of one year. However, it is possible that some of them had some marginal employment for some short period of time. From the figures presented in table 18, it is seen that, during 1999-2000, in general, the proportions are much higher in urban areas than in rural areas. States reporting high proportion of unemployed males also reported high proportion of unemployed females.

9.1.3 *rural males*: Among the major states, Kerala has reported the highest level of unemployment, 43 per thousand, followed by Assam(25)<sup>2</sup>, West Bengal(19), Tamil Nadu(18) and Orissa(17). The other major states with more than one per cent of their rural males usually unemployed are Himachal Pradesh(16), Jammu & Kashmir(14), Maharashtra(13), Punjab(13) and Bihar(12). In the smaller states and Union Territories where, the results will be based on a comparatively smaller sample size, the proportions show wide variations.

9.1.4 *Rural females*: In general, the proportions are much lower compared to rural males. In fact, among the major states, only Kerala and Assam showed proportions more than 1 per cent - at 39 and 12 per 1000 respectively

9.1.5 *Urban males*: The unemployed urban males are the most visible segment of the unemployment problem. This shows up in the estimates also. During 1999-2000, the usually unemployed constituted more than 2 per cent of the urban male population of all ages. Among the major states, during 1999-2000, West Bengal and Assam had almost 5 per cent of their urban males unemployed for a major part of the year. Kerala, Orissa and Bihar also reported rather high figures.

9.1.6 *Urban females*: Among the major states, the states of Kerala, Assam, Himachal Pradesh, West Bengal, Haryana and Tamil Nadu reported more than 1 per cent of their urban females unemployed.

9.1.7 To measure chronic unemployment, the usually unemployed excluding those employed in a subsidiary status (called the usual status adjusted) may be considered. Proportions generated making such adjustment would be smaller in magnitude than the usual status proportions. However, the regional pattern, as seen from table 19, is broadly similar to that of unadjusted usual status unemployment.

9.1.8 The proportions obtained using the current weekly status would be, in general, less than those obtained using the current daily status. These weekly status proportions have been presented in table 20.

9.1.9 The daily status concept incorporates the changes in the activity statuses of persons by taking into account the half-days data during the seven days of the reference week. The estimates based on the daily status, therefore, measure the extent of unemployment in terms of person-days rather than unemployed persons. To an extent the unemployed days of persons who are usually employed are also taken into account in this case. In a situation where large scale seasonal unemployment exists, the cds measure gives a better picture of the unemployment situation than the one relating to unemployed persons. The daily status estimates obtained from the present survey are presented in table 21. It is seen from the table that Kerala reported the highest proportion of unemployed person-days in the rural sector (76 person days out of 1000 person days) followed by Tamil Nadu (62) and West Bengal(55). The estimates for urban males were the highest for Kerala(69), followed by Assam(41), West Bengal(39) and Tamil Nadu(34).

## 10. Underemployment

10.1.1 Underemployment is commonly defined as the underutilisation of labour time of the workers. From the tables generated for this report, some measure/indicator of this feature have been presented in this sub-section.

10.1.2 Some of the persons categorised as usually employed do not have work throughout the year due to seasonality in work or otherwise and their labour time is not fully utilised - they are, therefore, underemployed. Their underemployment is termed *visible underemployment* if they report themselves to be available for work in respect to a shorter reference period, say, a week or each day of the week. From Table 8 of the Appendix A, a measure of the *visible underemployment* is obtained by cross classifying persons by their usual and current daily statuses.

10.1.3 On the other hand, some employed persons, particularly the *self-employed*, may appear to work throughout the year. But in terms of productivity or income, the work they are pursuing may not be sufficient for them. They may, therefore, want additional and/or alternative work in order to supplement their income. Such underemployment is termed as *invisible underemployment* and, therefore, not directly measurable. From Table 9 of the Appendix A, an indicator of *invisible underemployment* is obtained through a set of probing questions addressed to those categorised as usually employed on their availability for additional work, and reason for seeking such additional work. The proportion of the usually employed who indicate their availability for additional work, gives, by and large, an overall share of the employed who did not have enough work or at least, felt the need for additional work, and, in that sense, were underemployed.

10.1.4 *Visible underemployment*: The activity pattern of the usually employed during different days within the reference week is indicated by the distribution of their days by current daily status. The relevant results for rural and urban India are presented in Table 22. It is observed that the proportion of person-days of the usually employed utilised for work was quite low for females compared to males in all the survey years presented in the table. During 1999-2000, for females, it was about 68 per cent in rural India and 79 per cent in urban India as against 90 and 94 per cent for rural and urban males respectively during 1999-2000. It is also observed that when work is not available, a large proportion of females withdraw from labour force rather than report themselves as unemployed. The relevant results for different states and union territories are presented in tables 23R and 23U.

10.1.5 *Underemployed – seeking or available for additional work*: Table 24 gives the number of usual employed persons of age 15 years and above reporting themselves as seeking or available for additional work per thousand usually employed persons of age 15 years and above and their distribution by reason for their seeking or being available for additional work. It is seen from the table that during the year 1999-2000, in the stated age-group, about 11 per cent of usually employed rural males and 6 per cent of usually employed urban males had sought or were available for additional work. The corresponding percentages were 8 for rural females and 6 for urban females. The main reported reason for their seeking or being available for additional work was to supplement income, it being reported by more than half of them. 'Lack of enough work' was reported by 15 to 22 per cent of 'underemployed'. Thus, as per the survey results, for about 76 to 79 per cent of underemployment, either of these two factors, viz., a need to 'supplement income' or 'lack of enough work', had led to their seeking or being available for additional work. The proportion of 'underemployed' as per this indicator for different states and union territories is presented in table 25.

# **APPENDIX B**



## Sample Design and Estimation Procedure

### 1. Sample Design

1.1 A stratified multi-stage sampling design for rural as well as urban areas was adopted for selection of the sample units for the survey. The first stage units (FSU) were the census villages (panchayat wards for Kerala) for rural areas and the NSSO Urban Frame Survey (UFS) blocks for urban areas. The Ultimate stage units (USU) were the households for both rural and urban areas.

1.2 *Selection of the first-stage units:* The various steps involved before making the selection of the FSUs are discussed at length in the following few paragraphs before taking up the issue of selection of USUs within a FSU.

1.2.1 *Sampling frame for the first stage units (FSU's):* For rural areas, the list of census villages as per 1991 population census (list of census villages as per 1981 Census for the State of Jammu & Kashmir) constituted the sampling frame for selection of sample FSUs for most of the states. For the rural areas of Kerala, however, the list of panchayat wards was used as the sampling frame for selection of panchayat wards. For Nagaland, the list of villages located within 5 kms. of a bus route constituted the sampling frame, whereas, the list of accessible villages constituted the sampling frame for Andaman & Nicobar Islands. All the uninhabited villages of the country as per 1991 Census were left out of the survey coverage of the NSS 55th round. For the urban areas, the latest lists of UFS blocks constituted the sampling frame for selection of sample FSUs.

1.2.2 *Stratification of the first stage units in rural areas:* From the list of villages of each State/ Union Territory (U.T.), initially, two special strata were formed by considering villages (a) with very small population and (b) with very high population. These are formally stated below:

Stratum 1: all FSU's with population between 1 to 100,  
Stratum 2: FSU's with population more than 15,000.

The above two strata were spread across a given state and were not confined to any particular administrative division within the state. Each of the above two strata was formed if at least 50 such FSU's were there in the respective frames. Otherwise, these type of villages were included in the general strata as described below:

After formation of strata 1 and 2 (wherever applicable), the remaining villages of the State/ U.T. were considered for formation of general strata. While forming general strata, efforts were made to treat each district with population less than 2 millions as a separate stratum. If limitation of sample size did not allow forming so many strata, smaller districts within a particular NSS region were merged to form a stratum. Each district with rural population of 2 millions or more as per 1991 Census (1.8 millions or more as per 1981 Census in case of Jammu & Kashmir) was as usual split into a number of strata.

1.2.3 *Stratification of the first stage units in urban areas:* Within each NSS region, strata were formed by grouping towns on the basis of their population as per 1991 population census (1981 Census for the State of Jammu & Kashmir) following certain specifications which are stated below in a tabular form:

Stratum number	Composition of strata within a NSS region
1, 3, 5 *	'hospital area' (HA) / 'industrial area' (IA) / 'bazaar area' (BA) blocks taken together of each single city with a population of 10 lakhs or more (there could be a maximum of 3 such cities within an NSS Region)
2, 4, 6 *	Other blocks of each single city with a population of 10 lakhs or more
7	HA or IA or BA blocks of all towns with population between 50,000 to less than 10 lakhs
8	Other blocks of all towns with population between 50,000 to less than 10 lakhs
9	HA or IA or BA blocks of all towns with population less than 50,000
10	Other blocks of all towns with population less than 50,000

\* Stratum numbers 3, 4, 5 & 6 remained void if there was only one city in an NSS region with a population of 10 lakhs or more.

It may be noted that if limitation of sample size did not allow forming so many strata, all blocks of stratum 7 were merged with those of stratum 8 and all blocks of stratum 9 were merged with those of stratum 10.

1.2.4 *Allocation of FSU's among Strata:* At the all-India level, a total number of 10,384 FSU's (6208 villages and 4176 urban blocks) was selected for survey in the *central sample* in the 55th round. The actual state/ U.T. level allocation of FSUs in both the rural and urban sector are given in Table A at the end of this Appendix. The sample size at the state/U.T. level was allocated as follows:

(a) *in rural areas:* state/ UT level rural sample size was allocated among the rural strata in proportion to population.

(b) *in urban areas:* state/ UT level urban sample size was first allocated among the three classes of towns (i.e. 10 lakh +, 50000 to less than 10 lakhs and less than 50,000) in proportion to population. Then sample allocation for each of the three classes of towns, within an NSS region, was further allocated between two strata types consisting of - (i) HA/ IA/ BA blocks, and (ii) the rest in proportion to total number of FSU's in the respective frames with double weightage given to the first category of blocks.

1.2.5 *Sub-round wise allocation:* Sample size for the whole round for each State/UT x Sector (i.e. rural/ urban) were allocated equally among the 4 sub-rounds. Stratum level allocations for both rural and urban areas of a sub-round were made in even numbers in order to facilitate selection of FSU's in the form of 2 independent sub-samples. Sub-sample numbers were 1 & 2 for sub-round 1; 3 & 4 for sub-round 2; 5 & 6 for sub-round 3 and 7 & 8 for sub-round 4. One salient feature of the 55th round was the *rotation sampling scheme* which was adopted for the first time in the NSS for the purpose of

collection of employment-unemployment data from central sample only. Under this scheme, 1 sub-sample of the sampled first stage units (FSU's) of each sub-round was revisited in the subsequent sub-round. From each such FSU, sample households visited in the previous sub-round for collecting data on employment-unemployment were revisited in the subsequent sub-round for collecting employment-unemployment details.

1.2.6 *Selection of first-stage units*: For each sub-round, sample first-stage units from each stratum were selected afresh in the form of 2 independent sub-samples by following circular systematic sampling with :

- (a) probability proportional to population for all rural strata other than stratum 1, and
- (b) equal probability for rural stratum 1 as well as for all urban strata.

1.3 *Selection of Ultimate Stage Unit within FSU*: The remaining paragraphs of this sub-section outlines the various steps leading to the actual selection of USUs within a FSU.

1.3.1 *Formation of hamlet-groups/ sub-blocks*: In some cases, depending upon the approximate present population (P) and approximate total number of non-agricultural enterprises (E) of the villages/ blocks, the FSUs were further divided into a fixed number of hamlet groups/ sub-blocks, as per the rules stated below:

@ no. of hg's/ sb's = '1' implies that the whole FSU was considered for listing.

It may be noted that for rural areas of Himachal Pradesh, Sikkim and Poonch, Rajouri, Udhampur and Doda districts of Jammu & Kashmir, number of hamlet groups formed in the village as per population criterion was : 1 for P < 600, 5 for P = 600 to 999, 6 for P = 1000 to 1199, 7 for P = 1200 to 1399, 8 for P = 1400 to 1599, and so on (procedure remaining unchanged as per enterprise criterion). Further, the higher of the two values obtained as per population and enterprise criteria was taken as the number (D) of hamlet-groups (hg)/ sub-blocks (sb) to be formed in the FSU. In cases where hg's/ sb's were formed in the sample FSU, the same was done by more or less equalizing the population of the different hgs/ sbs of the FSU.

1.3.2 *Formation of Segments within FSU*: The hg/ sb having maximum concentration of non-agricultural enterprises was selected with certainty for listing of households/ enterprises. This hamlet group/ sub-block was referred to as segment 1. From the remaining (D-1) hg's/ sb's of the FSU, 2 more hg's/ sb's were selected circular systematically and these 2 selected hg's/ sb's together was referred to as segment 2 for doing a combined listing of households. The listing of households was done only in segments 1 and 2 of the FSU. The FSUs not requiring hg/ sb formation were treated as segment 1 for the purpose of data collection and estimation.

1.3.3 *Sampling frame of households:* All households of segments 1 and 2 of the FSU were listed independently and this list of households of the segments 1 and 2 constituted the sampling frame for the purpose of selection of sample households from the corresponding segments.

1.3.4 *Stratification of households:* All the households listed in a segment (both rural & urban) were stratified into two second stage strata, viz. 'affluent households' which formed second stage stratum 1, and the rest which formed second stage stratum 2. In the rural sector, a household was classified as 'affluent' if the household owned certain items like motor car/ jeep, colour TV, telephone, etc. or owned land / livestock in excess of certain limits. In the urban sector, the households with MPCE (monthly per capita consumer expenditure) greater than certain limit for a given town/city were treated as 'affluent' households and were included in the frame of second stage stratum 1, and rest of the urban households were included in the frame of second stage stratum 2.

1.3.5 *Selection of households:* Sample households were selected from the respective frames by circular systematic sampling with equal probability. For the purpose of systematic sampling, households in the frame of second stage stratum 2 were arranged by means of livelihood x land possessed classes for rural samples and by means of livelihood x MPCE classes for urban samples. The number of households selected for survey on employment -unemployment from different segments x second stage stratum (within a FSU) are specified below:

\* The fsus of sub-sample 1, sub-sample 3 and sub-sample 5 were re-visited during sub-round 2, sub-round 3 and sub-round 4 respectively. In the fsus of these re-visit sub-samples, all the households where schedule 10 was previously canvassed (i.e. during the previous sub-round) were re-visited for canvassing schedule 10.1. However, in case such a household could not be surveyed during re-visit, it was substituted and schedule 10 was canvassed in the substituted household. Further, schedule 10 was also canvassed for those households which were 'casualty' during visit 1 but could be surveyed during the re-visit. From among the newly formed households found during the re-visit of a fsu (which constituted the second stage stratum 9), at most 1 household was surveyed from each of the 2 segments and schedule 10 only was canvassed for those households.



## 2. Estimation Procedure

2.1 This estimation procedure adopted in the 55<sup>th</sup> round for schedule 10 provides

- (a) estimates on quarterly/ sub-round basis, and
- (b) the estimate of error from the sub-sample replicates.

Tabulated estimate for a quarter/ sub-round was obtained by combining the estimates of the corresponding sub-sample replicates. The estimation procedure adopted in the 55<sup>th</sup> round for schedule 10 is described below.

2.2 *Notation:* The notations used for estimation procedure are given below:

- a = subscript for the a-th stratum
- r = subscript for the r-th sub-sample replicate ( r = 1,2,...,8)
- q = subscript for the q-th sub-round / quarter (q=1,2,3 & 4)
- f = subscript for the f-th sampled village/ block as First Stage Unit ( FSU )
- s = subscript for the s-th segment of sampled village/ block ( s= 1 & 2)
- c = subscript for the c-th second stage stratum of households in the sampled village/ block (c= 1,2); for new households during revisit, c= 9.
- j = subscript for the j-th sampled household
- p = subscript for pooled estimate
- z = size used for selection of an FSU from the sampling frame
- Z = total of sizes in the sampling frame for the stratum
- n = number of sampled FSU surveyed within a stratum and a sub-sample replicate (including zero cases and uninhabited cases but excluding casualty cases) and used for tabulation
- L = number of sub-sample replicates surveyed and used for tabulation
- D = number of hamlet-groups/ sub-blocks formed in rural/ urban sampled FSU
- H = total number of households listed in the appropriate frame
- h = number of sampled households surveyed and used for tabulation from the frame
- y, x = value of characteristic y, x obtained in the sample
- $\bar{y}, \bar{x}$  = estimated value of characteristic y, x obtained from the sample.

2.3 *Estimates of aggregates:* If  $\bar{y}$  be the estimate of aggregate of any characteristic y for a given stratum (a), and for a particular sub-round (q) and sub-sample replicate (r), the formula used for estimating a characteristic of household from a given 2nd stage stratum (c) is as specified below:

*For rural areas:*

For urban areas:

where,  $B_{fsc} = \frac{H_{fsc}}{h_{fsc}}$ , for segment 1 (s=1) and  $B_{fsc} = \frac{D_f - 1}{2} \times \frac{H_{fsc}}{h_{fsc}}$ , for segment 2 (s=2).

These formulae are provided for the general case of FSU's having 2 segments 1 & 2. For the FSU's requiring no hg/ sb formation, the formula is identical to that given for segment 1 while the contribution from segment 2 is taken as zero.

Finally, the estimate of a characteristic y for a stratum (a), for a particular sub-round (q) and a sub-sample replicate (r) (which actually represented  $\hat{Y}_{aqr}$ ) was obtained as  $\hat{Y} = \sum_c \hat{Y}_c$ .

The combined estimate for a particular stratum and a particular sub-round was computed as the average of sub-sample replicate estimates and is given below:

If  $\hat{Y}_{qr}$  be the State/ UT/ Region level aggregate from the r-th sub-sample replicate and q-th sub-round, and  $\hat{Y}_{qp}$ , the combined estimate of the aggregate based on the whole sample, for a given sub-round/ quarter q, then:

2.4 *Estimates of ratios:* If  $\hat{X}$  &  $\hat{Y}$  be the State/ UT/ Region level aggregate estimate corresponding to variables x and y, then the estimate of ratio, in general, is given by

Estimates for the sub-round (/quarter)  $\hat{R}_{qr}$  and  $\hat{R}_{qp}$  was obtained by replacing  $\hat{Y}_r$  and  $\hat{Y}_p$  by  $\hat{Y}_{qr}$  and  $\hat{Y}_{qp}$ , respectively and  $\hat{X}_r$  and  $\hat{X}_p$  by  $\hat{X}_{qr}$  and  $\hat{X}_{qp}$ , respectively.

### 2.5 Treatment for casualty:

I) If  $H_{fsc} > 0$  but  $h_{fsc} = 0$  for a particular 2nd stage stratum of households in a FSU with no hamlet-group/sub-block formation (ie.  $D_f = 1$ ), it was a case of casualty and the value of  $n$  was reduced by 1.

II) If  $D_f > 1$  and  $H_{fsc} > 0$  but  $h_{fsc} = 0$  for  $s=1$  (say,  $s'$ ) and if it was not a case for the entire FSU, here  $n$  was not reduced by 1 and in this case  $[(D_f - 1)/2] \times H_{fsc}$  was replaced by  $\{H_{fsc} + [(D_f - 1)/2] \times H_{fsc}\}$  in the formula for  $s=2$ .

III) If  $D_f > 1$  and  $H_{fsc} > 0$  but  $h_{fsc} = 0$  for  $s=2$  (say,  $s'$ ) and if it was not a case for the entire FSU, here  $n$  was not reduced by 1 and in this case,  $H_{fsc}$  was replaced by  $\{H_{fsc} + [(D_f - 1)/2] \times H_{fsc}\}$  in the formula for  $s=1$ .

IV) If  $H_{fsc} > 0$  but  $h_{fsc} = 0$  for a particular second stage stratum of households in both the segments ( $s = 1$  & 2) in an FSU, it was a case of casualty and the value of  $n$  was reduced by 1.
