# Preface

In 1972-73 the National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO) began a quinquennial series of all-India surveys on Consumer Expenditure, Employment and Unemployment. Subsequently, an annual series of consumer expenditure enquiry was introduced from the NSS 42<sup>nd</sup> round (1986-87) onwards alongwith the main subject of survey. In this series, four households (two households up to the NSS 48<sup>th</sup> round, 1992) were selected for canvassing the consumer expenditure schedule in every surveyed village and urban block. The scope of the schedule was enhanced from the NSS 45<sup>th</sup> round (1989-90) by introducing some basic information on employment and unemployment. As a result, an annual series of data on both consumer expenditure and employment-unemployment is available since 1989.

The present report is based on the data on consumer expenditure and employment-unemployment collected during the NSS 59<sup>th</sup> round survey (January-December, 2003). The main findings of the enquiry on consumer expenditure are presented in Chapter Two, which discusses the variation in the level and pattern of monthly per capita consumer expenditure over rural and urban areas in selected States, including the group of North-Eastern States, and the Group of Union Territories. Also some key estimates on the standard of living of the rural and urban population are presented at broad levels for selected States and the Group of North-Eastern States/Union Territories. Chapter Three presents the key indicators of employment and unemployment obtained from the survey. The estimates of employment-unemployment are based on two approaches adopted in the NSS: *usual status* and *current weekly status*. In order to give a comparative picture of the employment situation over the period 1983 to 2003 (38<sup>th</sup> to 59<sup>th</sup> round), corresponding results obtained from all the previous surveys are given alongside. Detailed tables at the national level are given in Appendix A. The sample design and estimation procedure are explained in Appendix B. The Schedule of enquiry is provided in Appendix C. Concepts and definitions involved in collection of consumption data are discussed at the beginning of Chapter Two and those related to employment and unemployment are at Chapter Three.

All the technical work relating to this survey including, among others, development of sampling design, survey methodology and preparation of the report was undertaken by the Survey Design and Research Division of NSSO. The field work for the survey was handled by the Field Operations Division. The collected data were processed by the Data Processing Division. The overall co-ordination among different divisions was done by the Coordination and Publication Division. I am grateful to the Chairman and the members of the Governing Council of NSSO, as well as the Chairman and the members of the Working Group for the NSS 59<sup>th</sup> round survey, for their overall guidance from starting of the preparatory stage to the completion of the survey. The report, I hope, will be useful to the planners and policy makers.

Comments or suggestions from readers will be most welcome.

# **Highlights**

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## **Consumer expenditure**

- During the survey period January-December 2003, the all-India average monthly per capita consumer expenditure (MPCE) was Rs 554 for rural India and Rs 1022 for urban India. Thus, average urban MPCE exceeded average rural MPCE by 84%.
- In 2003, one-half of the rural population of India had MPCE below Rs 470. About 13% had MPCE below Rs 300. Among the urban population, 80% had MPCE above Rs.500. About 16% had MPCE above Rs.1500.
- For rural India, average MPCE of Rs 554 comprised Rs 299 for food and Rs 255 for non-food. Food expenditure included Rs 99 for cereals and cereal substitutes, and Rs 105 for milk, milk products, vegetables and edible oil. Non-food expenditure included Rs 51 for fuel and light, and Rs 44 for clothing and footwear.
- For the urban population, average MPCE of Rs 1022 comprised Rs 429 for food and Rs 593 for non-food. Of food expenditure, only Rs 102 went towards cereals and cereal substitutes while Rs 161 was spent on milk, milk products, vegetables and edible oil. Rs 94 was spent per person per month on fuel and light, and Rs 71 on clothing and footwear.
- The share of cereals in total consumption expenditure was 18% in rural India in 2003 compared to 26% in 1987-88. In urban India it was 10% in 2003 compared to 15% in 1987-88.
- The decline in the share of food in total expenditure seen over the past several rounds continued. The share of food was 54% in rural areas compared to 64% in 1987-88 and 42% in urban areas compared to 56% during 1987-88.

## **Adequacy of food**

- At the all-India level the proportion of chronically hungry households (not getting enough to eat even in any month of the year) was 3 per 1000 for rural areas and 1 per 1000 for urban. As for seasonal hunger, 13 per 1000 households in rural areas and 3 per 1000 households in urban areas reported getting enough food only in some months of the year.

## **Other living conditions**

- The proportion of rural households living in katcha structures was 21% in 2003 compared to 30% in 2000-2001. For urban households, the proportion of households living in katcha structures was 5% compared to 7% in 2000-2001.
- The proportion of urban households using LPG as cooking fuel rose to 55% in 2003 compared to 47% in 2000-01. Among rural households, the proportion increased to 9% from 7% in 2000-01.

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## **Employment and unemployment**

- The worker population ratio (WPR), i.e., number of persons employed per 1000 persons according to the usual status (principal and subsidiary status taken together) was much higher for males than for females in both rural and urban areas. In rural areas, the estimates were 55 and 31 percent for males and females, respectively. In urban areas, the corresponding estimates were 54 and 15 percent, respectively.
  - Both for males and females, the unemployment rates were appreciably higher in urban areas than in the rural areas. In rural areas, the unemployment rates according to the usual status (principal and subsidiary status taken together) for males and females were 2 and 1 percent respectively. In urban areas, the corresponding estimates were 4 percent for both males and females.
  - In rural India, according to the usual status (principal and subsidiary taken together), about 71 percent of the male workers and 85 percent of the female workers were engaged in agricultural activities. In urban India, about 60 percent of the male workers and about 50 percent of the female workers were engaged in the tertiary sector activities as per the usual status (principal and subsidiary status taken together).
  - The proportion of usually employed (principal and subsidiary status taken together) who reported themselves as not employed (i.e. unemployed or out of labour force) as per current weekly status was higher for females than for males. For females, it was 25 percent in the rural areas and 18 percent in the urban areas.
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# Chapter One

## Introduction

1.0 Beginning from the first round (1950-51) of the National Sample Survey (NSS), data on household consumer expenditure were collected in every round up to the 28th (1973-74). After the 26th round of the survey, the Governing Council of NSSO decided that the surveys on consumer expenditure and employment situation might be undertaken together on a large scale once in every five years. Accordingly, "quinquennial" surveys on consumer expenditure and employment surveys were conducted in the 27<sup>th</sup>, 32<sup>nd</sup>, 38<sup>th</sup>, 43<sup>rd</sup>, 50<sup>th</sup> and 55<sup>th</sup> rounds of NSS, at roughly 5-year intervals. In these rounds both survey schedules - Sch.1.0 dealing with household consumer expenditure and Sch.10, with employment-unemployment - were canvassed. For some years, the two schedules were canvassed in the same sample households, that is, households interviewed for Sch.1.0 were also interviewed during the same visit for Sch.10. From the 55<sup>th</sup> round (1999-2000) onwards, this linking was withdrawn to avoid a very long interview.

**1.1 Annual series:** The need for an annual series of data on consumer expenditure was also felt in the mid-80's by planners and research workers. The Governing Council therefore decided, one, that the quinquennial consumer expenditure-cum-employment surveys would be carried on as before, and, two, that every other round of NSS, starting from the 42<sup>nd</sup> (1986-87), would include a consumer expenditure enquiry with 2 (increased to 4 from 1993 onwards) sample households per sample village/block with a slightly abridged version of Sch.1.0. From the 45th round, it was decided to extend the scope of this "annual" survey on consumer expenditure enquiry on a reduced scale by introducing some important questions on activity status of household members in Sch. 1.0 so as to be able to generate some indicators on employment and unemployment as well. In each round since the 42<sup>nd</sup>, the duration of field investigation has been one year except for the 47<sup>th</sup>, 49<sup>th</sup>, 54<sup>th</sup> and 58<sup>th</sup> rounds, which were of six months' duration.

1.2 The present report gives the results of the 59<sup>th</sup> round survey (Jan-Dec 2003) on consumer expenditure and employment-unemployment, the fifteenth survey of the "annual" series. In the 59<sup>th</sup> round of NSS, Sch.1.0 was canvassed in 4 sample households per sample village/block. Besides Schedule 1.0, the following schedules of enquiry were also canvassed: Land and Livestock Holdings, Debt and Investment, and Situation Assessment Survey of Farmers. In all 26143 rural households spread over 6553 villages and 14870 urban households spread over 3757 urban blocks were surveyed in the Central sample.

**1.3 Geographical coverage:** The survey covered the whole of the Indian Union *except* (i) Leh (Ladakh) and Kargil districts of Jammu & Kashmir, (ii) interior villages of Nagaland situated beyond five kilometres of any bus route and (iii) villages in Andaman and Nicobar Islands which remain inaccessible throughout the year.

**1.4 Contents of the Report:** The main findings of the enquiry on consumer expenditure are presented in Chapter Two, which discusses the variation in the level and pattern of consumer

expenditure and other aspects of the standard of living of the rural and urban population of the country. Special attention is given to the quantity and value of cereals consumed per person. With the exception of cereals, consumption is expressed in value terms only. Other aspects of standard of living discussed in the report include level of education, fuel use, structure of dwelling, area of dwelling unit, and size of land possessed. Chapter Three presents the key indicators of employment and unemployment obtained from the 59<sup>th</sup> round survey. The estimates are based on two approaches followed in NSS surveys for collection of information on employment and unemployment: the usual status approach and the current weekly status approach. To give a comparative picture of the employment situation over the period from 1977-78 (32<sup>nd</sup> round) to July-December, 2002 (58<sup>th</sup> round), corresponding results obtained from the earlier surveys are given alongside. Some key estimates are presented at broad levels for the States or Union Territories as mentioned above. Concepts and definitions used in the collection of data are explained in Chapters Two and Three, separately for consumer expenditure and employment-unemployment. Detailed tables at State/ all-India level are given in Appendix A. The sample design and estimation procedure followed is given in Appendix B and a facsimile of the consumer expenditure schedule used, in Appendix C.

## Chapter Two

# Household Consumer Expenditure

### Concepts and Definitions

**2.0.0 Household:** A group of persons normally living together and taking food from a common kitchen constitutes a household. The word "normally" means that temporary visitors are excluded but temporary stay-aways are included. Thus, a son or daughter residing in a hostel for studies is excluded from the household of his/her parents, but a resident employee or resident domestic servant or paying guest (but not just a tenant in the house) is included in the employer/host's household. "Living together" is usually given more importance than "sharing food from a common kitchen" in drawing the boundaries of a household in case the two criteria are in conflict; however, in the special case of a person taking food with his family but sleeping elsewhere (say, in a shop or a different house) due to space shortage, the household formed by such a person's family members is taken to include the person also. Each inmate of a mess, hotel, boarding and lodging house, hostel, etc. is considered as a single-member household except that a family living in a hotel (say) is considered as one household only; the same applies to residential staff of such establishments.

**2.0.1 Adult:** A person who has completed 15 years of age.

**2.0.2 Household size:** The size of a household is the total number of persons in the household.

**2.0.3 Household consumer expenditure:** The expenditure incurred by a household on domestic consumption during the reference period is the household's consumer expenditure. Household consumer expenditure is the total of the monetary values of consumption of various groups of items, namely (i) food, *pan* (betel leaves), tobacco, intoxicants and fuel & light, (ii) clothing and footwear and (iii) miscellaneous goods and services and durable articles.

**2.0.4** For groups (i) and (ii), the total value of consumption is derived by aggregating the monetary value of goods actually consumed during the reference period. An item of clothing and footwear would be considered to have been consumed if it is brought into maiden or first use during the reference period. The consumption may be out of (a) purchases made during the reference period or earlier; (b) home-grown stock; (c) receipts in exchange of goods and services; (d) any other receipt like gift, charity, borrowing and (e) free collection. Home produce is evaluated at the ex farm or ex factory rate. For evaluating the consumption of the items of group (iii), i.e., items categorised as miscellaneous goods and services and durable articles, a different approach is followed. In this case, the expenditure made during the reference period for the purchase or acquisition of goods and services is considered as consumption.

**2.0.5** It is pertinent to mention here that the consumer expenditure of a household on food items relates to the actual consumption by the members of the household and also by the guests during ceremonies or otherwise. To avoid double counting, transfer payments like charity, loan advance, etc. made by the household are not considered as consumption for items of groups (i) and (ii), since transfer receipts of these items have been taken into account. However, the item "cooked meals" is an exception to the rule. Meals prepared in the household kitchen and provided to the employees and/or others would automatically get included in domestic consumption of employer (payer) household. There is a practical difficulty of estimating the quantities and values of individual items used for preparing the meals served to employees or others. Thus, to avoid double counting, cooked meals received as perquisites from employer household or as gift or charity are not recorded in the recipient household. As a general principle, cooked meals purchased from the

market for consumption of the members and for guests and employees will also be recorded in the purchaser household.

2.0.6 This procedure of recording cooked meals served to others in the expenditure of the serving households only leads to bias-free estimates of average per capita consumption as well as total consumer expenditure. However, donors of free cooked meals are likely to be concentrated at the upper end of the per capita expenditure range and the proportion of recipients at the lower end. Consequently, the derived nutrition intakes may get inflated for the rich (net donors) and understated for the poor (net recipients). This point has to be kept in mind while interpreting the NSS consumer expenditure data for any studies relating to the nutritional status of households.

2.0.7 **Value of consumption:** Consumption out of purchase is evaluated at the purchase price. Consumption out of home produce is evaluated at ex farm or ex factory rate. Value of consumption out of gifts, loans, free collections, and goods received in exchange of goods and services is imputed at the rate of average local retail prices prevailing during the reference period.

2.0.8 **Monthly per capita consumer expenditure (MPCE):** For a household, this is its total consumer expenditure divided by its size and expressed on a per month (30 days) basis. A person's MPCE is understood as that of the household to which he or she belongs.

2.0.9 Data from all States and UTs surveyed have been included in the all-India level estimates. Estimates for the rural (or urban) sector of a specific State/UT are normally presented separately from the all-India estimates only if at least 300 rural (or urban) households have been surveyed in the State/UT. However, estimates for Jammu & Kashmir, Haryana, Assam and Orissa have been presented for both rural and urban areas to facilitate comparison with the previous round even though the number of urban sample households in these States was under 300. In respect of the rural sector, the number of States for which estimates have been presented separately is 22, and for the urban sector it is 18. In addition, estimates for the two groups "North-Eastern States" (which excludes Assam) and "Group of UTs" are, as usual, also presented. The composition of these two groups is as follows: *North-Eastern States*: Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Sikkim and Tripura. *Group of UTs*: Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Chandigarh, Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Daman & Diu, Lakshadweep and Pondicherry.

2.0.10 Statement 2.1 shows the number of villages and urban blocks allotted for survey and the numbers actually surveyed, and the number of households in which Schedule 1.0 was canvassed. 140 sample villages falling in disturbed areas – 124 in Jammu & Kashmir and 16 in Assam – could not be surveyed. Apart from this, 32 villages – 13 in Tamil Nadu and 19 in the Andaman & Nicobar Islands – became casualties as they could not be surveyed within the deadline set for the first visit to each sample village (see Appendix B, paragraph no.4).

2.0.11 **Reference period:** The reference periods used for collection of consumption data for different groups of items are given below:

education, medical care (institutional), clothing, footwear and durable goods	last 365 days
all other items, viz., food, pan, tobacco and intoxicants, fuel & light, miscellaneous goods & services, and medical care (non-institutional)	last 30 days

2.0.12 **Milk and milk products:** This includes ghee, butter, curd, ice-cream etc. Milk-based sweetmeats (*pera, rasogolla* etc.) come under items "prepared sweets". However, if these are prepared from milk, sugar, etc. within the household and consumed, then the consumption of

ingredients is accounted separately instead of the entire consumption being accounted under "milk products".

**2.0.13 Clothing and footwear:** This category includes bedsheets, bedcovers, pillows, curtains, mattresses, blankets, rugs, mats and mattings, cotton yarn, wool, and knitting wool. It, however, excludes tailoring charges, which come under "miscellaneous goods and services".

**2.0.14 Durable goods:** Items included here are distinguished from other miscellaneous goods by having a longer expected lifetime of use (roughly, one year or more). Expenditure incurred on repairs, and purchase and construction of durables used for domestic purpose is included in "expenditure on durable goods".

**2.0.15 Miscellaneous goods and services:** This is a residual group containing items other than food, pan, tobacco, intoxicants, fuel and light, clothing, footwear, rent, taxes and durable goods.

2.0.16 **Katcha:** A *katcha* structure is one whose walls and roof are made of *katcha materials*, which means materials such as mud, bamboo, grass, leaves, reeds, thatch or unburnt bricks, etc.

2.0.17 **Pucca:** A *pucca* structure is one whose walls and roof are made of *pucca materials*, which means materials such as burnt bricks, stone, cement, concrete, jackboard (cement-plastered reeds) and timber. Tiles, galvanised tin or asbestos cement sheets used in construction of roofs are also regarded as pucca materials.

2.0.18 **Semi-pucca:** A semi-*pucca* structure is one of which either the roof or the walls but not both is made of pucca materials (see above).

2.0.19 **Independent house:** An independent house is one which has a separate structure and entrance with self-contained arrangements. In other words, if the dwelling unit and the entire structure of the house are physically the same, it is considered as an independent house. Here dwelling unit means living rooms, kitchen, bathroom, latrine, store-room and verandah (both open and closed).

2.0.20 **Flat:** A flat, generally, is a part of a building and has one or more rooms with self-contained arrangements and normal housing facilities like water supply, latrine, toilet etc., which are used exclusively by the family residing therein or jointly with other families. It also includes detached room or rooms which may or may not have other housing facilities.

## Results of the Survey

2.1.0 The NSS survey of household consumer expenditure generates a very important indicator of human living standards called monthly per capita consumer expenditure (MPCE). The present report, first and foremost, brings out various facets of this indicator.

2.1.1 The report takes up, in the order given below:

- Some demographic features of the population
- Distributions of households and persons by MPCE
- Average MPCE
- The absolute and percentage composition of MPCE by items of consumption
- Consumption of cereals - the major constituent of the Indian diet
- Perception of households on whether they get enough to eat
- Other aspects of level of living such as education level, structure and area of dwelling unit, energy sources used for cooking and lighting
- Other features on which information was collected through the consumer expenditure schedule.

## 2.2 Population structure

2.2.1 Table P1 presents some key indicators of population in rural and urban India. The rural population had 957 females per 1000 males and the urban, 932 females per 1000 males. Average household size in rural India was 5.0 including 1.8 children per household. In urban India the average household size was 4.5 with 1.3 children per household.

2.2.2 The variation in average household size with MPCE is evident from Table P2. Average rural household size declined steadily from 6.2 in the lowest MPCE class to 3.8 in the highest. In urban areas the decline was from 6.6 to 2.9. More details are available in Table 1 of Appendix A. This reveals that much of the variation in household size with MPCE was accounted by the under-15 age group. The average number of members under 15 per rural household is seen to decline from 3.1 in the lowest MPCE class to 0.8 in the highest class. In urban India the average number of "children" per household was about 3.3 in the lowest MPCE class and 0.4 in the highest.

2.2.3 State-level averages of household size are shown in the last two columns of Table P3.

### 2.3 Distribution of population by MPCE: all-India

2.3.1 The distribution of the rural and urban population of India over 12 MPCE classes is shown in Table P2. The MPCE classes are formed differently for rural and urban sectors. About 13% (133 per 1000) of the rural population are seen to have had MPCE below Rs.300 during the period of survey. One-half of the rural population (502 per 1000) is found to have been below the MPCE level of Rs.470 (cumulating the figures in the second column of Table P2 for the first seven classes) while the other half lived above this level. In urban India, 20% of the population (202 per 1000) were below the MPCE level of Rs.500 (adding the figures in the last column but one over the first four MPCE classes). At the other extreme, about 16% (158 per 1000) of the urban population had MPCE exceeding Rs.1500. The average household size of this group was, of course, much lower than that of the urban population as a whole (see last column of the table for the two highest MPCE classes).

2.3.2 Statements 2.2R and 2.2U (pages 17 and 18) show the State-level distributions of *households* by MPCE class, while Statements 2.3R and 2.3U (pages 19 and 20) show the State-level distributions of *persons* by MPCE class, including the all-India distributions presented separately in Table P2 and discussed just now.

#### 2.4 Average MPCE: States and all-India

2.4.1 Statements 2.3R and 2.3U also show average MPCE at State and all-India level. The averages of MPCE for selected States, and a measure of the rural-urban differential in each State, are presented separately in Table P3 below.

2.4.2 The all-India rural average MPCE was Rs.554. At State level, the lowest average MPCE for rural areas was Rs.398 (Orissa) and the highest was Rs.981 (Kerala). Among the 16 States shown in Table P3, average rural MPCE was below Rs.450 in three States, between Rs.450 and 650 in ten States, and above Rs.650 in three States.

2.4.3 Five States – Bihar, Jharkhand, Orissa, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal – registered lower average MPCE than the all-India average for both the rural and the urban population. In addition, Madhya Pradesh (rural) had MPCE below the all-India rural average, and urban areas of Rajasthan, Karnataka and Assam had lower average MPCE than the all-India urban average.

2.4.4 The all-India average MPCE in the urban sector was Rs.1022. State-level average urban MPCE exceeded Rs.750 for all the States shown here except for Bihar, where it was Rs.674. Like the rural sector, average MPCE for the urban sector too was highest in Kerala (Rs.1300), Rs.1250 in Punjab, and more than Rs.1100 in two other States among those considered here.

2.4.5 Average urban MPCE exceeded average rural MPCE by 84% at the all-India level. Rural-urban disparity measured by percentage difference of urban MPCE over rural MPCE was lowest in Kerala at 33% and was also comparatively low in Punjab (41%) and Haryana (46%).

## 2.5 Per capita expenditure on different items of consumption: all-India

2.5.1 Statements 2.4R and 2.4U (pages 21-24, 25-27) show the break-up of MPCE by item group at State and all-India level. Table P4 below gives the all-India picture in brief, focussing on rural-urban differentials in spending. Note, however, that self-consumed home-produced food is also accounted as “food expenditure”.

2.5.2 For rural India, per capita 30 days' consumer expenditure of Rs. 554 broke up into Rs.299 for food and Rs.255 for non-food. In urban India, of Rs.1022, Rs.429 was spent on food and Rs.593 on non-food.

2.5.3 The consumer expenditure per person on cereals and cereal substitutes reported by the rural and urban households was not very different. For all other item groups, urban per capita expenditure was higher than the corresponding rural figure. The differential was highest (understandably) for rent – Rs.2 (rural) vs. Rs.50 (urban). The differential was also high for education: Rs.16 for rural vs. Rs.65 for urban India. For consumer services, per capita urban consumption was Rs.120, more than three times the rural figure of Rs.38.

2.5.4 For most of the (nine) food groups shown here, per capita urban spending was within Rs.5-15 of per capita rural spending. The exceptions were “milk and milk products” (Rs.45 for rural and Rs.80 for urban) and “beverages, refreshments & processed food” (Rs.25 for rural and Rs.62 for urban).


2.5.5 Non-food expenditure per person in urban India, at Rs.593, was higher than rural food and non-food expenditure put together (Rs.554).

## 2.6 Percentage break-up of MPCE by item group: all-India


2.6.1 Statements 2.5R and 2.5U (pages 28-31, 32-34) express the item-wise expenditure figures of Statements 2.4R and 2.4U as percentages of total MPCE, for selected States/UTs and all-India. Figures 1R and 1U present the percentage composition of all-India MPCE by seven groups of items.

- (a) There was little difference between rural and urban sectors in the shares of “milk & milk products”, “vegetables”, “other food”, “clothing & footwear”, and “fuel & light”.
- (b) Important rural-urban differences were present in the budget share of “cereals” (rural share 18%, urban 10%), and “other non-food” (rural share 29%, urban 42%).
- (c) Important contributors to the high share (42%) of “other non-food” in urban India were consumer services (12%), “miscellaneous consumer goods” and “education” (both between 6% and 7%) and “medical” (about 6%). (See Statement 2.5U, all-India column.)

## 2.7 Inter-State variation in broad consumption pattern

2.7.1 Details of inter-State differences in consumption pattern are available in Statements 2.4R and 2.4U (pages 21-24, 25-27) and also in Statements 2.5R and 2.5U (pages 28-31, 32-34). Table P5 below shows per capita expenditure on cereals, per capita expenditure on food, and share of both cereals and food as a whole in total expenditure for major States.

2.7.2 For rural India, State-level food expenditure per person varied, generally, in the range Rs. 225-Rs.450. It was lowest in Orissa (Rs.231). It was between Rs.240 and Rs.260 in Madhya Pradesh, Bihar and Jharkhand. The national average, as noted earlier, was Rs.299. The share of food in total expenditure varied from 45% for the high-MPCE States of Punjab and Kerala to over 60% for Assam, West Bengal, Bihar and Jharkhand.

2.7.3 In urban India, inter-State variation in per capita food expenditure was much less. Except for Bihar (Rs.338) and Uttar Pradesh (Rs.355), this expenditure was within the range Rs.375-Rs.500 for all the major States. The share of food expenditure was between 36% and 50%.

2.7.4 As usual, per capita expenditure on cereals was highest in the eastern part of the country and lowest in the predominantly wheat-consuming States. The highest rural figures were those of Assam (Rs.132) and West Bengal (Rs.129) and the lowest those of Punjab and Haryana (Rs.72) and Gujarat (Rs.77).

2.7.5 At State level, the share of cereals in total expenditure in rural India varied from 8% in Punjab and 9% in Haryana to 26% in Bihar, 27% in Jharkhand and 28% in Orissa. Thus it was closely related (inversely) to average MPCE. In urban India, the share varied less, from 6% for Punjab to 16% for Assam and Bihar.


## 2.8 Consumption of cereals

2.8.1 Tables 2 (R&U) of Appendix A show monthly per capita *quantity* of consumption of specific cereals at all-India level for households in different MPCE classes. Tables 3 (R&U) of the Appendix show corresponding *values* of consumption for different MPCE classes, again at all-India level. Statements 2.6R and 2.6U (pages 35-36) show quantity of consumption of cereals at *State* as well as all-India level, though not separately for MPCE classes. The corresponding per capita values of consumption of cereals per person at State and all-India level are shown in Statements 2.7R and 2.7U (pages 37-38). Note here that the value of consumption of home produce is imputed at ex farm prices. As usual, per capita consumption of cereals in rural areas was consistently higher in the rural areas than in the urban areas of each State. The following points are of interest:

- a) All-India average of per capita monthly consumption of cereals was 12.34 kg in the rural sector and 9.90 kg in the urban. The break-up by different cereals is depicted in Figure 2.
- (b) Rice and wheat together accounted for 11.05 kg of monthly per capita cereal consumption in the rural sector and 9.41 kg in the urban.

(c) Among major States, the largest per capita consumption of rice occurred in rural Orissa (13.98 kg per month). The largest per capita consumption of wheat occurred in rural Punjab (9.24 kg per month).

(d) Of the total value - Rs.100 - of per capita cereal consumption in rural India, Rs.61 consisted of rice and Rs.31 of wheat. In urban India, value of per capita cereal consumption was Rs.102, of which rice accounted for Rs.57 and wheat, Rs.41.

## 2.9 Trends in all-India average per capita consumption expenditure, and in consumption pattern at all-India level, since 1987-88

2.9.1 The composition of household MPCE at the all-India level is shown for three quinquennial consumer expenditure surveys of NSS (43<sup>rd</sup>, 50<sup>th</sup> and 55<sup>th</sup> rounds) along with the 56<sup>th</sup>, 57<sup>th</sup>, 58<sup>th</sup> and 59<sup>th</sup> rounds of NSS in Statements 2.8R and 2.8U (pages 39-40). Apart from average MPCE at current prices, the second line from bottom of each table presents indices of average MPCE using the 43<sup>rd</sup> round figure as base (=100). The corresponding consumer price indices, (CPI for agricultural workers for rural areas and CPI for non-manual employees for urban areas), again with 1987-88 as base, are shown in the last row of the statement.

2.9.2 Statements 2.9R and 2.9U (pages 41-42) give the percentage composition of household MPCE corresponding to the figures given in Statements 2.8R and 2.8U. The following are among the noticeable features of the data:

- (a) The index of all-India rural MPCE in money terms has increased to 351 in this round from 100 in 1987-88 (43<sup>rd</sup> round). Consumer prices in rural India have increased during the same period from 100 to 288 (index values). This would indicate a rise in real consumption expenditure of the order of 22%.
- (b) For urban India, the index of average MPCE in money terms rose from 100 in 1987-88 to 409 in 2003, indicating a real increase of 26% with the consumer price index having increased from 100 to 325 over the same period.
- (c) In 2003 the average rural Indian spent 18 paise on cereals out of every rupee he spent on household consumption, compared to 26 paise in 1987-88. The average urban resident spent 10 paise of his rupee on cereals compared to 15 paise in 1987-88.
- (d) In both rural and urban India, the share of food in total expenditure continued to fall throughout the period 1987-2003. The overall fall was from 64% to 54% in rural areas and from 56% to 42% in urban areas. The fall was spread over nearly all food groups for urban areas. In rural areas, the share of a few food groups registered an increase – in particular, vegetables (from 5% to over 6%).

(e) The share of fuel and light in household consumer expenditure rose from under 7% to 9% in both sectors. The share of the “pan, tobacco and intoxicants” group fell noticeably in the urban sector from 2.6% to 1.6%.

2.9.3 Trends in average household size, average MPCE and selected percentiles of the distribution of persons by MPCE may be studied from Statement 2.10 (page 43), which gives estimates for the 43<sup>rd</sup>, 50<sup>th</sup>, and 55<sup>th</sup> to 59<sup>th</sup> rounds. This statement also shows average MPCE at constant (1987-88) prices. For rural areas, the price index number used is the CPI for agricultural labourers with base 1986-87=100 and for urban areas, the CPI for urban non-manual employees with base 1984-85=100. Average MPCE at constant prices (a measure of “real consumption”) is seen to have increased from Rs.158 to Rs.193 during 1987-2003 in rural India and from Rs.246 to Rs.314 in urban India. But per capita quantity of consumption of cereals showed a declining trend over the period 1987–2003 in both sectors, indicating that whatever rise there was in real consumption took place in items of consumption other than cereals.

## 2.10 Subjective perception of households regarding sufficiency of food intake

2.10.1 In addition to collecting responses of surveyed households on recall-based consumption and consumer expenditure which were objectively measurable, NSSO had also been seeking subjective perceptions regarding the food availability for the households by asking question: “Do all members of your household get enough to eat?” (Answers: A. Yes, every month of the year; B. Some months of the year; C. No month of the year.) The responses are summarised through estimated proportions of households in each category. State-wise estimates are provided in Tables 5R and 5U of Appendix A, separately for rural and urban areas.

2.10.2 The picture of hunger at the all-India level obtained was as follows: *Chronic hunger*: Only 3 rural households and only 1 urban household per 1000 remained hungry all through the year. *Seasonal hunger*: The proportion of households getting enough to eat for some months of the year but not all was 13 per thousand in rural India and 3 per thousand in urban India. Statement 2.11 (page 43) shows some evidence of a decline in both kinds of hunger over the last few years, at least in the rural areas, even if the appreciably higher estimates of the hungry obtained from the last quinquennial round (55<sup>th</sup> round of NSS) are somewhat difficult to explain.

2.10.3 The highest incidence of hunger was, clearly, in rural areas of Orissa, where 58 households per 1000 were victims of seasonal hunger and 13 per 1000 were chronically hungry. Rural West Bengal and rural Assam both had more than 40 households per 1000 reporting either seasonal or chronic hunger. In urban Assam, 35 per 1000 households reported chronic hunger, more than the number reporting seasonal hunger.

## 2.11 Literacy

2.11.1 Statement 2.12 (page 44) gives per thousand break-up of the all-India male, female and total 7+ population by five broad education levels. The break-ups are given for five rounds up to the present one. State-level break-ups – using ten levels of education instead of five - are provided in Tables 6R and 6U of Appendix A. Figures 3R and 3U below give the literacy rates (in percentage form) at all-India level.

2.11.2 At the all-India level, the literacy rate for rural and urban India combined (not shown in the tables of this report) was: males: 76%; females: 55%; males & females combined: 65%.

Figure 3R: Literacy rate - all-India (rural)





Figure 3U: Literacy rate - all-India (urban)



2.11.3 Figures 3R and 3U show little change in the literacy position over the past four rounds with the rural male literacy rate remaining around 71-72%, the rural female rate at about 48%, the rate for urban males at about 88% and that for urban females at around 74%. The annual surveys (that is, all the rounds excluding the 55<sup>th</sup>), however, show appreciably higher literacy rates for the rural sector for both males and females than the quinquennial survey, a fact which is yet to be explained.

### Other aspects of living conditions

#### 2.12 Energy for cooking

2.12.1 Statement 2.15 (page 45) shows the distributions of rural and urban households by primary source of energy used for cooking, as obtained on the basis of this round and the previous four. The most striking change, of course, is in the proportion of urban households using LPG as fuel. This would appear to have increased by five and a half percentage points (from 499 to 554 per 1000) since the last full-year round, the 57<sup>th</sup> (2001-02), which means in less than two years. Apparently around 25 urban households per 1000 have switched over from kerosene to LPG over this period. The proportion of urban kerosene users, in fact, has been falling uninterruptedly since 1999-2000 (55<sup>th</sup> round) and has dropped from 22% to 13% in this period of less than four years. There has also been some fall in the proportion of urban households using firewood and chips, though the estimates here exhibit more irregular fluctuation over the rounds. In rural India, the proportion of LPG users has increased from 54 per 1000 in 1999-2000 (going by 55<sup>th</sup> round data) to 91 per 1000. The use of nearly all other fuels has declined. However, firewood and chips continued to dominate the rural scene with three-quarters of households using it as principal cooking fuel.

2.12.2 State-level data on source of energy for cooking are presented in Tables 9R and 9U of Appendix A. Table 9R shows that the use of LPG in rural areas was most common in Punjab and Himachal Pradesh (around 28% households). 14-20% households used LPG in rural areas of Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Maharashtra, Gujarat, Haryana, and Jammu & Kashmir. In all other major States, the proportion was below the national average of 9%.

2.12.3 Table 9U shows that of the 18 States for which estimates for the urban sector are presented separately, the proportion of urban households using LPG for cooking exceeded 50% in as many as 14 States. Over 40% of urban households in Kerala and Orissa used firewood and chips, more than twice the all-India average of 20%.

### 2.13 Type of dwelling and type of structure

2.13.1 Statement 2.14 (page 45) shows the per 1000 break-up of rural and urban households by type of structure: katcha, semi-pucca and pucca – as obtained from the last four rounds of NSS. The proportion of rural households living in katcha structures is seen to have sharply fallen from 30% to 21% over this period of less than four years. The proportions of rural households in both pucca and semi-pucca structures have increased, the former somewhat more than the latter. For the urban sector, the 58<sup>th</sup> and 59<sup>th</sup> round estimates, though close to each other, suggest, when compared with the 56<sup>th</sup> and 57<sup>th</sup> rounds, that the proportion of urban katcha structures has also declined by 2-3 percentage points over the last three years.

2.13.2 Tables 8R and 8U of Appendix A show the two-way distribution of households by type of structure and type of dwelling at State and all-India level. The all-India figures are shown in Table P6 below. The proportion of independent houses among household dwelling units is seen to be 63% in urban areas, with flats forming another 21%. The proportion accounted by the “other” category, which includes all dwellings that are not self-contained but involve sharing of some facilities, was 16% for all urban dwellings and was not much different if one considered dwellings with pucca structures only.

### 2.14 Energy for lighting

2.14.1 Statement 2.16 (page 46) shows the distribution of households by primary source of energy for lighting for India as a whole over the last five rounds, separately for rural and urban areas. The number of rural households using electricity for lighting, by the evidence of the past four rounds, now outstrips the number using kerosene. The proportion using electricity was estimated from this round to be 52% and the proportion using kerosene, 47%. The estimates thus tally with those of the last round, the 58<sup>th</sup>. In urban areas, the proportion using electricity remained stable at around 91%. State-level data are provided in Table 10 of Appendix A.


## Other characteristics of households

### 2.15 Covered area of dwelling unit

2.15.1 Tables 11R and 11U in Appendix A give average covered area of different types of dwelling units - independent house, flat and the rest - in rural and urban areas of different States.

**2.16 Occupancy position:** Figure 4 gives the percentage break-up of households according to whether they owned, rented or otherwise occupied their dwelling units, for all-India - rural and urban. The proportion of households living in hired dwelling units was about 32% in urban India and only about 4% in rural India. Statement 2.13 (page 45) gives corresponding figures for recent rounds. The slight increase seen in this round's data in percentage of urban households owning their dwelling unit could be a real increase or a result of sampling fluctuations. The State-level break-ups of rural and urban households by occupancy status (in per 1000 form) are given in Tables 7R and 7U of Appendix A. The proportion of urban households occupying rented dwelling units was as low as 17% in Kerala and Rajasthan but nearly 49% in Tamil Nadu and 46% in Jharkhand.

### 2.17 Land possessed

2.17.1 The distribution of rural households over different size classes of land possessed at State and all-India level is given in Table 12R of Appendix A. The all-India average MPCE for each size class is also shown.

### 2.18 Social group and occupational type

2.18 All-India distributions of rural and urban households over social groups, as estimated from this survey, are shown in Statement 2.17 (page 46). The corresponding estimates from the past four rounds are also presented alongside, and provide a means of assessing the validity of the data. The distributions of rural and urban households by household occupational type (based on major means of livelihood over the previous year) are given in Statements 2.18R and 2.18U, along with corresponding estimates from the past four rounds.

## Chapter Three

# Employment and Unemployment

### 3.0 Introduction

3.0.1 To assess the volume and structure of employment and unemployment, starting with the 9th round (May-September, 1955), NSSO conducted a number of surveys on employment and unemployment. To give a firm conceptual framework for conducting such surveys, the Planning Commission, in the year 1970, set up an "Expert Committee on unemployment estimates", (popularly known as the Dantwala Committee), which reviewed these surveys and the indicators generated from such surveys. Based on concepts and definitions recommended by this committee, the first quinquennial survey on employment and unemployment was conducted in the 27<sup>th</sup> round of NSS during September 1972-October 1973. Since then, five quinquennial surveys on employment and unemployment situation in India have been carried out by the NSSO, in which concepts and procedures were based primarily on the recommendations of the Dantwala Committee. These five surveys were conducted during the 32nd round (July, 1977-June, 1978), 38th round (January, 1983-December, 1983), 43rd round (July, 1987-June, 1988), 50th round (July, 1993-June, 1994) and 55th round (July, 1999-June, 2000), respectively. Survey on employment and unemployment during the 27<sup>th</sup>, 32<sup>nd</sup>, 38<sup>th</sup>, 43<sup>rd</sup> and 50<sup>th</sup> rounds was carried out along with the survey on consumer expenditure on the same set of households. In the 55<sup>th</sup> round, the schedule on 'consumer expenditure' and 'employment and unemployment' were canvassed for the set of households selected independently for the two schedules in a first stage unit.

3.0.2 Apart from these six quinquennial surveys on employment and unemployment, in order to generate "annual" series of key indicators of 'employment and unemployment', NSSO has been regularly collecting information on certain key items on employment and unemployment from a limited set of households in each of the annual rounds since the 45th round (July, 1989-June, 1990) through the schedule on Household Consumer Expenditure (Schedule 1.0). Like the other annual rounds, information on the usual and current weekly status of members of the household, category of employment, industry of work of the usually employed were collected in the NSS 59th round (January-December, 2003), through the 'demographic' block of the schedule on 'consumer expenditure'.

### 3.1 Conceptual framework adopted for the survey

3.1.1 The main objective being the generation of annual indicators of employment and unemployment, the information collected is aimed at classifying the population into different activity categories on the basis of the activities pursued by the household members during specified reference periods adopting two different approaches. The approaches are:

- (i) *usual status* approach with a reference period of 365 days preceding the date of the interview; and
- (ii) *current weekly status* approach with a reference period of 7 days preceding the date of the interview.

3.1.2 The various activity categories along with the corresponding codes used in the 59<sup>th</sup> round were as follows:

*Note:* Codes 61,62,71,72, 82 and 98 were applicable only for current weekly status approach.

3.1.3 Persons reported as engaged in any one or more of the activities listed under the category codes 11 to 72 (11 to 51 for usual status) during the specified reference period constituted the 'working' (or employed) group. A person assigned activity category code 81 or 82 (81 for usual status) was considered 'seeking and/or available for work' (or unemployed). The employed and unemployed together constituted the 'labour force'. Any person reported to be engaged in or as

belonging to one or more of the activities under the categories 91 to 99 (91 to 97 and 99 for usual status) was classified as 'not in labour force'.

**3.1.4 Classification according to usual status approach:** In the *usual status* approach, the status of activity on which a person spent a relatively longer time of the reference period of 365 days preceding the date of interview is first considered for deciding the principal usual activity status of the person. The activities pursued by a person are grouped into three broad categories: (i) working or employed, (ii) seeking or available for work, i.e., unemployed, and (iii) not in labour force. A two-stage dichotomous classification is applied for classification according to usual status approach. The procedure involves a classification into 'labour force' and 'out of labour force' in the first stage and thereafter the labour force into 'employed' and 'unemployed' in the second stage. Within the broad principal usual status category identified for a person, detailed principal status is assigned on the basis of the relative duration of time spent on different activities. A person categorised as a 'worker' or 'employed' on the basis of his principal status is referred to as principal status worker. A 'non-worker' (on the basis of the principal usual activity status) who pursued some economic activity in a subsidiary capacity was considered to be usually working in a subsidiary capacity and is referred to as 'subsidiary status worker'. These two groups, viz. 'principal status workers' and 'subsidiary status workers', together constituted 'all workers' according to the usual status classification. These concepts are identical to those adopted from the NSS 50th round survey onwards for classification of population according to the usual status.

**3.1.5 Classification according to current weekly status approach:** For classification of persons according to *current weekly status*, they had to be initially assigned a unique activity status with reference to a period of 7 days preceding the date of the interview. This posed no problem in the case of persons having only one status during the reference week. However, a unique status was assigned to persons pursuing more than one activity during the week by adopting a priority-cum-major-time rule. For assigning broad activity category (status), the status of 'working' got priority over the status of 'not working but seeking/available for work' and the status of 'seeking/available for work' got priority over the status of 'not working and not seeking/not available for work'. But within the broad category of 'working' or 'not working', the detailed activity category was assigned by major time criterion, i.e., the activity in which a major part of time was spent was considered the current weekly activity. More specifically, a person was considered 'working' (or employed) if he/she was engaged in any one or more of the economic activities (11 to 72) for at least one hour on any one day of the reference week. Further, he/she was assigned that economic activity category (11 to 72) in which he/she spent major share of the working time during the reference week. A person who had not worked for even one hour on any one day of the week, but had been seeking work or had been available for work (although not seeking) at any time during the week was considered 'seeking/available for work' (or unemployed). Others were considered 'not available for work' (or not in the labour force). Each member of the sample household was, thus, assigned a unique current weekly activity status for the week. Aggregates of persons under different activity statuses, thus assigned, provided the distribution of persons by current weekly activity during an average week of the survey period. Here it may be mentioned that in the quinquennial rounds, the current weekly activity status is derived from the time disposition of members on various activities on each day during the 7 days preceding the date of survey, while in the annual rounds the current weekly activity status is determined directly.

## 3.2 Definitions

**3.2.1 Economic activity:** Economic activity is any activity that results in production of goods and services that adds value to national product. Such activities include production of all goods and services for market, i.e., production for pay or profit and production of primary commodi-

ties for own consumption and own-account production of fixed assets, among the non-market activities. The entire spectrum of human activity falls into two categories: economic and non-economic activities. The economic activities have two parts: market activities and non-market activities. As per the concept of UN System of National Accounts 1993, market activities are those that involve remuneration to those who perform it, i.e., activity performed for pay or profit including Government services, etc. and non-market activities are production for own consumption of primary products including own account processing of primary products and own-account production of fixed assets. The full spectrum of economic activities as defined in the UN System of National Accounts 1993 has not been covered in the definition adopted for the current survey or in the previous surveys. The term ‘economic activity’ as adopted in the survey includes:

- i) All the market activities described above, i.e., the activities performed for pay or profit which result in production of goods and services for exchange.
- ii) Among the non-market activities,
  - a) all the activities relating to the agricultural sector (industry divisions 01 to 05 of NIC 1998) which result in production (including gathering of uncultivated crops, forestry, collection of firewood, hunting, fishing, etc.) of agricultural produce for own consumption, and
  - b) the activities relating to the own-account production of fixed assets. Own-account production of fixed assets include construction of own houses, roads, wells, etc., and of machinery, tools, etc., for household enterprise and also construction of any private or community facilities free of charge. A person may be engaged in own-account construction in the capacity of either a labourer or a supervisor.

3.2.2 In this context, it may be noted that up to the 49th round of NSS the term used was ‘gainful activity’. The concept of economic activity is very close to the concept of ‘gainful activity’ except for the inclusion of own-account production of fixed assets. The contribution of this component was found to be negligible from a separate tabulation of this component in the 43<sup>rd</sup> round survey and therefore the comparability of the survey results over time will be virtually unaffected by this change.

3.2.3 According to the international standards, the term ‘economically active population’ comprises persons of either sex who furnish the supply of labour for production of goods and services as defined in the United Nations System of National Accounts during a specified time reference period. According to this system, the production of goods and services includes all production and processing of primary products, whether for market, for barter or for own consumption, production of all other goods and services for the market and, in the case of households which produce such goods and services for the market, corresponding production for own consumption. The definition adopted in the NSS follows the above approach very closely except for the ‘processing of primary commodities for own consumption by the producers of these items’, which is not covered by the NSS definition. Further, the international standards use the term ‘economically active population’ as a generic term and use two related measures, viz., the ‘usually active population’ in relation to a long reference period such as a year and the ‘currently active population’ measured in relation to a short reference period such as a week or a day. Generally, the term ‘labour force’ is used to denote the currently active population. In this report the term ‘labour force’ is meant to imply the population segment comprising the employed and the unemployed. In conventional terms, the employed, unemployed and those in the labour force are defined as follows.

**(a) Workers (or employed):** Persons who are engaged in any economic activity or who, despite their attachment to economic activity, have abstained from work for reasons of illness, injury or other physical disability, bad weather, festivals, social or religious functions or other contingencies necessitating temporary absence, constitute workers. Unpaid helpers who assist in the operation of an economic activity in the household farm or non-farm activities are also regarded as workers.

**(b) Seeking or available for work (or unemployed):** Persons who, owing to lack of work, had not worked but either sought work through employment exchanges, intermediaries, friends or relatives or by making applications to prospective employers, or expressed their willingness or availability for work under the prevailing conditions of work and remuneration, are regarded as those 'seeking or available for work' or as 'unemployed'.

**(c) In labour force and not in labour force:** Persons who are either 'working' or 'seeking or available for work' (i.e., are unemployed) during the reference period constitute the labour force. Persons who are not working and at the same time are neither seeking nor available for work during the reference period are considered to be 'out of labour force'. The persons under this category are students, those engaged in domestic duties, rentiers, pensioners, recipients of remittances, those living on alms, or infirm or disabled, beggars, prostitutes, smugglers, etc., and casual workers not working due to sickness, etc.. However, a domestic servant who is considered a member of the employer's household is treated as a worker though he/she may be performing only household chores.

**(d) Worked as self-employed in household enterprises:** Persons who operate their own farm or non-farm enterprises or are engaged independently in a profession or trade on own-account or with one or a few partners are self-employed in household enterprises. The essential feature of self-employment is that the remuneration is determined wholly or mainly by sales or profits of the goods or services which are being produced. The self-employed persons are further categorised into three groups:

**(i) Own-account workers - usual and current status code 11:** They are the self-employed persons who operate their enterprises on their own-account or with one or a few partners and who, during the reference period, by and large, run their enterprise without hiring any labour. They may, however, have unpaid helpers to assist them in the activity of the enterprise.

**(ii) Employers - usual and current status code 12:** These are self-employed persons who work on their own-account or with one or a few partners and, by and large, run their enterprise by hiring labour.

**(iii) Helpers in household enterprises - usual and current status code 21:** The helpers are mostly family members who keep themselves engaged in their household enterprises, working full or part time and do not receive any regular salary or wages in return for the work. They do not run the enterprise on their own, but assist the related person living in the same household running the enterprise. Persons who worked in the capacity of 'helpers' but has a share in the family earnings are also considered as helpers.

**(e) Worked as regular salaried/wage employee - usual and current status code 31:** Persons working in others' farm or non-farm enterprises, both household and non-household, and getting, in return, salary or wages on a regular basis (and not on the basis of daily or periodic renewal of work contract) are the regular salaried/wage employees. This category not only includes persons getting time wage but also those receiving piece wage or salary and paid apprentices, both full-time and part-time.

**(f) Worked as casual wage labour - usual and current status codes 41 and 51:** A person casually engaged in others' farm or non-farm enterprises (both household and non-household) and, in return, getting wage according to the terms of the daily or periodic work contract is a casual wage labour. Depending on whether they are so employed in 'public works' sponsored by Govt. agencies or local bodies or in other types of work, the casual workers are classified into two groups, viz, casual labour in public works (41) and casual labour in other types of works (51).

**(g) Had work in household enterprise but did not work due to sickness/ other reasons - current status code 61/62, and had regular salaried/wage employment but did not work due to sickness/other reasons - current status code 71/72:** Persons engaged in farm or non-farm enterprises or working in others' farm or non-farm enterprises but absenting from work temporarily due to sickness/for enjoying leave or holiday, or for other reasons, belong to these two categories 61/62 and 71/72, respectively, depending on whether they are self-employed in household (farm or non-farm) enterprises or employed in others' (farm or non-farm) enterprises as regular wage/salaried employees.

**(h) Attended domestic duties and was also engaged in free collection of goods, sewing, tailoring, weaving, etc., for household use - usual and current status code 93:** In rural areas in general and particularly in tribal areas, domestic work usually includes, among other things, a lot of work in free collection of vegetables, roots, firewood, etc., and in activities like sewing, tailoring, weaving, etc., for household use. Persons found to be regularly spending some of their time in performing the above activities along with household chores belong to this category.

### **3.3 Summary of findings**

3.3.1 As mentioned earlier, in NSS 59<sup>th</sup> round, in the Central Sample, 6,553 villages and 3,757 blocks were surveyed covering 26,143 and 14,870 households, respectively, in rural and urban sectors of India. Number of sample persons in the rural and urban areas was 150351 and 62513 respectively. Two approaches, viz, usual status approach and current weekly status approach, were followed for collection of information on employment and unemployment. The key indicators of employment and unemployment obtained from the 59th round survey based on these two approaches are presented here. The discussions are mostly confined to all-India estimates only. In order to have a comparative picture of the employment-unemployment situation over the period from 1983 (38<sup>th</sup> round) to January 2003 – December 2003 (59<sup>th</sup> round), corresponding results obtained from the earlier surveys, wherever available, are placed side by side. While comparing the estimates obtained from the 59<sup>th</sup> round with those from other rounds, it must be kept in mind that as in the other annual surveys, due to a smaller sample size in the NSS 59<sup>th</sup> round, some key estimates are presented at the broad levels only for (i) the states where number of sample households were 300 or more, (ii) groups of North-Eastern states and (iii) groups of UTs. in Statements 3.8 to 3.11. Detailed all-India tables are given in Appendix A of the report.

3.3.2 While interpreting the comparative estimates obtained from various rounds, it is to be noted that the results pertaining to 1983, 1987-88, 1993-94 and 1999-2000 are based on quinquennial surveys with a relatively large number of sample households, while estimates for other rounds are based on the annual surveys conducted for smaller samples of households. Further, in the 47<sup>th</sup>, 49<sup>th</sup>, 54<sup>th</sup> and 58<sup>th</sup> rounds, the survey period was of six months duration only. The 47<sup>th</sup> round covered the period from July to December, 1991, the 49<sup>th</sup> round, from January to June, 1993, the 54<sup>th</sup> round, from January to June, 1998 and the 58<sup>th</sup> round, from July to December, 2002. It may be noted that in the annual rounds as well as in the quinquennial surveys up to the 43<sup>rd</sup> round, current weekly activity status of the household members was

determined through a direct question while in the 50<sup>th</sup> round and in the 55<sup>th</sup> round the same for a person was determined based on the activity statuses on each of the 7 days of the reference week.

### **3.4 The employed**

3.4.1 The estimates of number of persons employed per 1000 persons or Worker Population Ratios (WPRs), also called the Work Force Participation Rates (WFPRs), have been obtained according to the usual status and current weekly status approaches. The employed - in terms of usual status, are classified into 'principal status workers' (ps) and 'all workers' (ps+ss - principal and subsidiary status workers taken together). The 'usual status approach' is based on a reference period of last 365 days and provides the long-term picture of employment and unemployment. Therefore, the estimates based on this approach do not reveal the seasonal fluctuations in the activity pattern over the quarters of a year. The 'current weekly status approach', on the other hand, is based on the last week's activity situation and, therefore, reflects the overall effects caused by intermittent and seasonal changes in the activity pattern during the year. Hereinafter, the term 'usually working' is used to mean working in both the principal and subsidiary status.


3.4.1.1 From the WPRs by sex given in Statement 3.1 for rural and urban India, it is seen that at the all-India level, the employment scenario has remained generally stable over the years 1983 to 2003. According to the usual status (ps+ss), the WPR, which, in 1983, was around 55 per cent for rural males, rose to 56 per cent in 1994-95, then gradually declined to 53 per cent in July 1999 – June 2000, and then remained stable at 55 per cent during the period July 2001 to December 2003. In case of urban males, the WPR according to the usual status (ps+ss), varied between 51 and 55 per cent over the years 1983 to 2003. It remained at around 52 per cent from 1994-95 to 1997, then fell by about 1 percentage point in January - June, 1998, after which it rose gradually to 55 per cent in July 2001 – June 2002 and then it declined to 54 per cent during January 2003 – December 2003. The corresponding WPRs for females varied between 26 and 34 per cent in the rural sector and between 11 and 15 per cent in the urban sector during the period 1983 to 2003.

3.4.1.2 The current weekly status proportions show a similar pattern as the usual status proportions. As expected, they are found to be somewhat lower than the usual status rates, the difference being larger in rural India than in urban India, especially for females.

**3.4.2 Age-specific work participation rates (ASWPRs):** The WPRs according to the usual status (ps+ss) as obtained from the present survey, are given for certain broad age-groups in Statement 3.2. The detailed Table 17 in the appendix provide ASWPRs for 5-yearly age-groups according to the usual status (ps+ss). These have been plotted in the accompanying Figure 1 separately for males and females in the rural and urban sectors.

From the Statement 3.2 it can be seen that during January 2003 – December 2003, WPR for persons of age 15-59 years was 87 per cent for rural males and 80 per cent for urban males. For females, the corresponding percentages were 49 in rural areas and 21 in urban areas. During the period January 2003 – December 2003, for the rural females in the age-group 15-59 years, the WPR showed 4 per cent increase as compared to the corresponding estimates obtained for the period July 2002 - December 2002 and it became equal to the WPR value for the period July 2001 – June 2002. For the rural females in the age group 15-29 during January 2003 – December 2003, the WPR showed 4 per cent increase as compared to the corresponding estimates obtained for the period July 2002 - December 2002.

**3.4.3 Worker population ratio by household type:** The type/ nature of work which fetched the maximum income from economic activities of the household during the reference period of 365 days preceding the date of survey determines its household type. The WPRs according to the usual status (ps + ss) for persons belonging to various household types have been obtained for persons of age 15 years and above, and these are given in Statement 3.3. The estimates obtained from the earlier 58<sup>th</sup> round annual survey, conducted during July 2002 - December 2002, are also given side by side. During the period January 2003 – December 2003, the WPR was the highest for agricultural labour households in the rural areas and for casual labour households, in the urban areas. This was true for both males and females. During this period, in the rural areas, about 89 per cent of the adult males and 60 per cent of the adult females belonging to the agricultural labour households were “working”. In the urban areas, about 86 per cent of the adult males and 34 per cent of the adult females belonging to the casual labour households were “working”. The variation in WPRs by household type is quite large, particularly among the adult females.

**3.4.4 Distribution of the usually employed persons by category of employment:** Persons employed are categorised into three broad groups according to their status of employment. These groups are: (i) self-employed, (ii) regular wage/ salaried employees and (iii) casual labour. The distribution of the usually employed by category of employment is given in Statement 3.4. The basic distribution of the employed in terms of status of employment shows that more than half of the employed in the rural areas were in the 'self-employed' category. During the period January 2003 – December 2003, the percentages of regular employees among the employed in usual principal status were about 9 for males and 4 for females in the rural areas. In the urban areas, among the males, employed according to the usual principal status, about 42 per cent were engaged in the regular wage/ salaried employment and the corresponding proportion of females was 41 per cent. It may be observed from Statement 3.4 that for males employed in usual principal status, in both rural and urban areas, the distribution of employed persons by status of employment was quite similar during January 2003 – December 2003 to that during July 2002 - December 2002. However, among females employed in usual principal status in rural areas, the proportion of casual labourers increased by about 3 percentage points during July 2001 - June 2002 to July 2002 - December 2002 and decreased by about 5 percentage points during July 2002 - December 2002 to January 2003 – December 2003. In the urban areas, among the females employed according to usual principal status, the proportion of casual labourers decreased by about 4 percentage points during July 2001 - June 2002 to January 2003 – December 2003.

**3.4.5 Distribution of usually employed by broad groups of industry:** The distribution of workers by industry and the shift of the workforce away from the agricultural sector (primary sector) to the manufacturing and the tertiary sectors is an important aspect in the study of the structure of employment. Statement 3.5 gives the per 1000 distribution of the usually working by broad group of industry.

For the purpose of study, the industry divisions (01-99) of NIC 1998 have been categorized as (i) primary (01-05), (ii) secondary (10-45) and tertiary (50-99)<sup>1</sup>. It may be mentioned that from the NSS 45<sup>th</sup> round till the NSS 54<sup>th</sup> round, NIC 1987 was used, while in NSS 43<sup>rd</sup> and 38<sup>th</sup> rounds, NIC 1970 had been used. It may be seen from Statement 3.5 that, among the employed males and females, majority are engaged in the primary sector in the rural areas, while in the urban areas majority are engaged in the tertiary sector. Among those employed according to the usual principal status, in the rural areas, more than 70 per cent of the males and 84 per cent of the females were engaged in the primary sector, while in the urban areas 60 per cent of the males and 56 per cent of the females were engaged in the tertiary sector.

### **3.5 The unemployed**

3.5.1 Two different estimates are obtained from the annual survey data for the 'unemployed', viz. (i) number of persons unemployed based on the usual status classification and (ii) number of persons unemployed based on the current weekly status classification. The first estimate relates to persons unemployed for a relatively longer period during the reference period of last 365 days and approximates to an indicator of the chronic unemployment. Two estimates of the usually unemployed are presented - usually unemployed in terms of their principal status (ps) and usually unemployed excluding the subsidiary status workers (usual adjusted). Some of the unemployed identified on the basis of principal status might be working in a subsidiary capacity. Hence the unemployment rate derived on the basis of usual status adjusted is expected to be lower than that based on principal status. The other estimate, i.e., the one based on current weekly status, gives the average weekly picture of unemployment during the survey year and covers both chronic unemployment and intermittent unemployment caused by seasonal and short-run fluctuations in the employment of those categorised as usually employed.

**3.5.2 Unemployment rates (URs):** Number of persons unemployed per thousand persons in the labour force (i.e., total of employed and unemployed) is termed as the unemployment rate. Statement 3.6 gives the UR along with the number of persons unemployed per 1000 persons. As usual, the proportion of unemployed in the population as well as the unemployment rate is higher in urban areas than in rural areas. Further, these are higher among males than among females in the rural areas. In the rural areas, the proportions of the unemployed as well as the unemployment rates, according to both the usual and the current weekly statuses, have remained almost unchanged compared to the NSS 58<sup>th</sup> round. In urban areas, the unemployment rates have decreased for both males and females during the period January 2003 – December 2003 as compared to the period July 2002 - December 2002 – the decrease was about 1 percentage point for females.

**3.5.3 Unemployment rate by household type:** In Statement 3.3 given earlier, the unemployment rate in terms of usual status (ps+ss), is presented separately for rural and urban areas of India and by household type. The URs have been obtained for persons aged 15 years and above. It is seen that in both the rural and urban areas, unlike the WPRs, the UR is the highest among males and females belonging to the household type ‘others’. For rural areas, the ‘others’ category includes mainly the households depending largely upon regular wage earnings *and* households whose major income is from activities other than economic activities. But, for the urban areas, the ‘others’ category comprises households whose major income is from activities other than economic activity only. It may also be noted from Statement 3.3 that the incidence of unemployment is very low for the households mainly depending on the earnings from self-employment in farm or non-farm business.

**3.5.4 Under-utilisation of labour time of the usually employed:** In an economy such as ours, where agriculture-based activities are the mainstay of a majority of the population in rural areas, there is a strong possibility of under-utilisation of labour time or, in other words, of the incidence of under-employment. This is because many of the agriculture-related activities can absorb a large number of persons at a very low productivity level and with a marginal engagement. Moreover, as agriculture-related activities are seasonal in nature, persons may not find enough work in lean seasons, though they may get categorised as employed as per their usual status. A classification of the usually employed by their current weekly status may bring out the dimension of real engagement of the persons categorised as employed according to their usual status. Taking into account both the principal and the subsidiary status, Statement 3.7 gives the distribution of the usually employed by their current weekly status. The corresponding results obtained from the 43<sup>rd</sup> round onwards are also presented in the Statement. It is observed that among the usually employed males about 96% are currently employed in the rural areas and in the urban areas about 97% are currently employed. Among the usually employed females 82% in urban areas and 75% in rural areas are currently employed. Compared to the previous annual round, in the 59<sup>th</sup> round, in both rural and urban areas, the current employment of those who are usually employed have decreased by 1 percentage point for males and for the females the decrease was about 2 percentage points.

### **3.6 State-wise estimates**

3.6.1 In view of the relatively small sample sizes at the State level in the annual survey on consumer expenditure and employment-unemployment carried out in the 59<sup>th</sup> round, the detailed State-level tables are not presented in the Appendix to the report. Key results are, however, presented for (i) the States where number of sample households were 300 or more, (ii) groups of North-Eastern States and (iii) groups of UTs. in Statements 3.8 to 3.11. The titles of the Statements are listed below:

**Statement 3.8:** Per 1000 distribution of persons by broad current weekly activity by State/UT.

**Statement 3.9:** Per 1000 distribution of persons by broad usual activity (principal) by State/UT.

**Statement 3.10:** Per 1000 distribution of persons by broad usual activity (PS+SS) by State/UT.

**Statement 3.11:** Per 1000 distribution of usually working persons by broad group of industry.

Statements 3.8 to 3.10 give the State-wise distributions of population by broad activity status according to current weekly status, usual status (principal) and usual status (principal and subsidiary), respectively. The distribution of the usually working persons according to the principal status and both the principal and subsidiary status over the three broad groups of industry sections, viz., primary, secondary and tertiary are presented in Statement 3.11.

3.6.2 The groups of North-Eastern States /Union Territories shown in these Statements are:

- i) North-Eastern States: Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Sikkim and Tripura.
- ii) Union Territories: Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Chandigarh, Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Daman & Diu, Lakshadweep and Pondicherry.

3.6.3 Broad activity statuses used for the purpose are:

- (i) self-employed, (ii) regular wage/salaried employees, (iii) casual labour, (iv) unemployed, (v) students, (vi) engaged in domestic duties and (vii) others not in labour force.

3.6.4 The estimated total population (or no. of workers) figures are also shown in the Statements 3.8 to 3.10 (or Statement 3.11) for each of the States and group of North-Eastern States /Union Territories. It is to be noted that the population estimates from the NSS enquiries are generally lower than the census-based population figures due to differences in coverage, methodology, etc. Therefore, these totals can be used to combine the proportions at the desired level only and should not be used for generating absolute figures for national aggregates under any category. To do this, one is advised to use the NSS proportions on either the census population or census-based projected population.

## Appendix B

### Sample Design and Estimation Procedure

**1. Geographical coverage:** The survey covered the whole of the Indian Union *except* (i) Leh (Ladakh) and Kargil districts of Jammu & Kashmir, (ii) interior villages of Nagaland situated beyond five kilometres of the bus route and (iii) villages in Andaman and Nicobar Islands which remain inaccessible throughout the year.

**2. Period of survey:** The survey period of this round was January to December, 2003.

**3. Sub-rounds:** The survey period of the round was divided into two sub-rounds. Sub-round one consisted of the first half of the survey period of each visit while sub-round two consisted of the remaining period. Equal numbers of sample fsu's are allotted to each sub-round and an fsu is normally surveyed in the sub-round to which it is allotted. Because of arduous field conditions, this restriction is not strictly enforced in Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Lakshadweep, and rural areas of Arunachal Pradesh and Nagaland.

**4. Visits:** Apart from consumer expenditure, there were three other subjects of enquiry in the 59<sup>th</sup> round of NSS: Land and Livestock Holdings, Debt and Investment, and Situation Assessment Survey of Farmers. All three subjects required two visits to each sample household for collection of data: one during January to August and the other during September to December. Accordingly, each sample first stage unit (village or block) was visited twice by the investigator to whom it was allotted. For the three surveys other than consumer expenditure, the households surveyed earlier were surveyed a second time in the second visit. For the consumer expenditure schedule, on which this report is based, a new set of two households was surveyed during the second visit from each sample fsu. The field work during the first visit included the canvassing of the listing schedule (Sch 0.0) and selection of the sample households.

**5. Participation of States:** In this round all the States and Union Territories except Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Lakshadweep participated at least on an equal matching basis. The following is the matching pattern of the participating States/UTs.

Nagaland (Urban)	: triple
J & K, Manipur & Delhi	: double
Goa, Maharashtra (Urban)	: one and half
Remaining States/UTs	: equal

#### 6. Sample design

**6.1 Broad design:** A stratified multi-stage design was adopted for the 59<sup>th</sup> round survey. The first stage unit (fsu) was the census village in the rural sector (panchayat ward for Kerala) and the UFS block in the urban sector. Households formed the ultimate stage units in both sectors. Hamlet-groups/ sub-blocks constituted the intermediate stage whenever they were formed in the selected fsu.

**6.2 Sampling frame for first-stage units:** For rural areas, the list of villages (panchayat wards for Kerala) as per Population Census 1991 was used as sampling frame. For urban areas the latest UFS frame was used. For stratification of towns by size class, provisional populations of towns as per Census 2001 were used.

### 6.3 Stratification

#### 6.3.1 Rural sector:

Two *special strata* were formed at the State/ UT level:

- Stratum 1: all fsu's with population between 0 to 50 and
- Stratum 2: fsu's with population more than 15,000.

**6.3.1.1** Special stratum 1 was formed whenever at least 50 such fsu's were found in a State/UT. Similarly, special stratum 2 was formed if at least 4 such fsu's were found in a State/UT. Otherwise, such fsu's were merged with the general strata.

**6.3.1.2** From fsu's other than those covered under special strata 1 & 2, *general strata* were formed, their numbering starting from 3 onwards. Each district of a State/UT was normally treated as a separate stratum. However, if the census rural population of the district was greater than or equal to 2 million as per Population Census 1991 or 2.5 million as per Population Census 2001, the district was split into two or more strata by grouping contiguous tehsils. However, in Gujarat, some districts were not wholly included in an NSS region. In such cases, the part of the district falling in each NSS region constituted a separate stratum.

**6.3.2 Urban sector:** In the urban sector, strata were formed within each NSS region on the basis of size class of towns as per Population Census 2001. The stratum numbers and their composition (within each region) are given below.

The stratum numbers remained as above even if, in some regions, some of the strata did not exist.

**6.4 Total sample size (fsu's):** 10608 fsu's were allocated at all-India level on the basis of investigator strength in different States/UTs for the Central sample and 11496 for the State sample.

**6.5 Allocation of total sample to States and UTs:** The total number of sample fsu's was allocated to the States and UTs in proportion to provisional population as per Census 2001 subject to the availability of investigators, so as to ensure more or less uniform workload.

**6.5.1 Allocation of State/UT level sample to rural and urban sectors:** State/UT level sample size was allocated between the rural and urban sectors in proportion to provisional population as per Census 2001 with 1.5 weightage to urban sector subject to the restriction that urban sample size for bigger states like Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, etc. would not exceed the rural sample size. The earlier practice of giving double weightage to urban sector was modified considering the fact that two important subjects of enquiry (Land and Livestock Holdings and Situation Assessment Survey of Farmers) were rural-based and there had been considerable growth in urban population over the years. More fsu's were, however, allocated to the rural sector of Meghalaya state sample at the request of the DES, Meghalaya.

**6.5.2 Allocation to strata:** Within each sector of a State/UT, the sample size was allocated to the different strata in proportion to the stratum population as per Census 2001. Allocations at stratum level were adjusted to a multiple of 2 with a minimum sample size of 2. However, a multiple of 4 fsu's was allocated to a stratum wherever possible.

**6.6 Selection of fsu's:** In all the rural strata except for stratum 1, fsu's were selected with Probability Proportional to Size With Replacement (PPSWR), size being the population as per

Population Census 1991. In stratum 1 of the rural sector and in all the strata of the urban sector, selection was done using Simple Random Sampling Without Replacement (SRSWOR). Samples were drawn in the form of two independent sub-samples in both rural and urban sectors.

## 6.7 Selection of hamlet-groups, sub-blocks and households

**6.7.1 Formation of hamlet-groups/sub-blocks:** Large villages/blocks having approximate present population 1200 or more were divided into a suitable number of hamlet-groups/sub-blocks as shown below:

**6.7.3** Hamlet-groups/ sub-blocks were formed by more or less equalising population. Two hamlet-groups/ sub-blocks were selected from a large village or block by SRSWOR. Listing and selection of the households was done independently in the two selected hamlet-groups/sub-blocks so formed.

## 6.8 Formation of second-stage strata (SSS)

**6.8.1 Rural:** From the data of NSS 48<sup>th</sup> round, households having land area 0.005 hectares or more were identified. The area of land Y was determined for each State/UT, such that 80% of the households there possessed land less than Y.

**6.8.2 Urban:** Using NSS 55<sup>th</sup> round data, a value C of MPCE was determined at State/UT level such that 90% of the households in the State/UT had MPCE less than C.

**6.8.3** Two second-stage strata were formed in each fsu as shown below:

**Rural:**

SSS 1: households possessing land < Y  
 SSS 2: households possessing land = Y

**Urban:**

SSS 1: households with MPCE < C  
 SSS 2: households with MPCE = C

**6.9 Allocation and selection of sample households:** Two households were selected from each second-stage stratum. In case of hamlet group/ sub-block formation, one household was selected from each SSS of each hamlet group/ sub-block. Sample households were selected by SRSWOR in each SSS of each h-g/s-b. Out of the four households thus selected, two households were covered in visit 1 and two in visit 2.

$$\hat{Y}_s = \frac{1}{2} \sum_{m=1}^2 \hat{Y}_{sm}$$

### 7.3.1 Overall Estimate of Aggregates at State/UT/all-India level:

The overall estimate  $\hat{Y}$  at the State/ UT/ all-India level is obtained by summing the stratum estimates  $\hat{Y}_s$  over all strata belonging to the State/ UT/ all-India.

### 7.4 Estimates of Ratios:

Let  $\hat{Y}$  and  $\hat{X}$  be the overall estimate of the aggregates Y and X for two characteristics  $y$  and  $x$  respectively at the State/ UT/ all-India level.

Then the combined ratio estimate ( $\hat{R}$ ) of the ratio ( $R = \frac{Y}{X}$ ) is obtained as

### 7.5 Estimates of Error:

The variances of the above estimates are estimated as follows:

A) For aggregate  $\hat{Y}$ :

- Note: (i) For estimating any characteristic for any domain not specifically considered in the sample design, an indicator variable may be used.  
(ii) Multipliers are computed on the basis of information available in the listing schedule irrespective of any misclassification observed between the listing schedule and detailed enquiry schedule.

## 7.7 Treatment for zero cases, casualty cases etc.

**7.7.1** While counting the number of fsu's surveyed ( $n_{sm}$ ) in a stratum, all the fsu's with survey codes 1 to 6 in listing schedule 0.0 are considered. In addition, if no household is available in the frame, the fsu is still treated as surveyed. However, if households are available in the frame of the fsu but none of them could be surveyed, then that fsu must be treated as casualty.

**7.7.2 Casualty cases:** Fsu's with survey code 7 as per listing schedule 0.0 are treated as casualties. In addition to this, an fsu, although surveyed, may have to be treated as casualty for a particular schedule type and a particular *second stage stratum* as explained in the next paragraph.

**7.7.3** Fsu's with survey codes 1 and 4 as per listing schedule having number of households in the frame of j-th second stage stratum greater than 0 but number of households surveyed according to data file, considering both hg/sb together, as nil (i.e.  $H_{1j} + H_{2j} > 0$  but  $h_{1j} + h_{2j} = 0$ ) are taken as casualties for j-th second stage stratum.

**7.7.4 All the fsu's with survey codes 1 to 6 as per listing schedule minus the number of casualties as identified above are taken as the number of surveyed fsu's ( $n_{smj}$ ) for that stratum  $\times$  second stage stratum.**

**7.7.5** When casualty for j-th second stage stratum occurs for a particular hg/sb but not for the other hg/sb, the fsu is not treated as casualty, but some adjustments in the value of H for the other hg/sb are done as follows:

- (i) Suppose for hg/sb 1,  $H_{1j} > 0$  but  $h_{1j} = 0$  while for hg/sb 2,  $H_{2j} > 0$  and  $h_{2j} > 0$ . In that case  $D_i^* \times H_{i2j}$  is replaced by  $H_{1j} + D_i^* \times H_{i2j}$  in the formula for multiplier of segment 2.
- (ii) Suppose for hg/sb 1,  $H_{1j} > 0$  and  $h_{1j} > 0$  while for hg/sb 2,  $H_{2j} > 0$  but  $h_{2j} = 0$ . In that case  $H_{1j}$  is replaced by  $H_{1j} + D_i^* \times H_{i2j}$  in the formula for multiplier of hg/sb 1.

*It may be noted that  $n_{smj}$  will be the same for hg/sb 1 & 2 of an fsu.*

## 7.8 Treatment in cases of void second-stage strata/sub-strata /strata/NSS region at fsu or household level

**7.8.1** A stratum may be void because of the casualty of all the fsu's belonging to the stratum. This may occur in one sub-sample or in both the sub-samples. If it relates to only one sub-sample, then the estimate for the void stratum is replaced with the estimate obtained from the other sub-sample for the same stratum.

7.8.2 When a stratum is void in both the sub-samples, the following procedure is used:

### Case (I): Stratum void cases at fsu levels (i.e. all fsu's having survey code 7):

- i) If a rural stratum, except stratum 1, is void then it may be merged with a similar stratum within the same NSS region. However, if rural stratum 1 is void for any State/UT, it is not merged with any other stratum.
- ii) If an urban stratum is void then it may be merged with another stratum within the same NSS region.
- iii) If all the strata within an NSS region are void, it is regarded as excluded from the coverage of the survey. The state level estimates are based on the estimates of NSS regions for which estimates are available.

### Case (II): Stratum void case at second stage stratum level (i.e. all the fsu's are casualties for a particular second stage stratum):

An fsu may be a casualty for a particular *second stage stratum* although survey code is not 7. If all the fsu's of a stratum become casualties in this manner for a particular *second stage stratum*, the stratum becomes void. The adjustment for this type of stratum void case is done according to the following guidelines.

The adjustment is made involving other strata (within NSS region) of the State/U.T. Suppose A, B, C, and D are the four strata in the State/UT/Region and stratum C is void for j-th *second stage stratum*. If  $\hat{Y}_{aj}$ ,  $\hat{Y}_{bj}$  and  $\hat{Y}_{dj}$  are the aggregate estimates for the strata A, B and D respectively, then the estimate  $\hat{Y}_{cj}$  for stratum C is obtained as 
$$\left( \frac{\hat{Y}_{aj} + \hat{Y}_{bj} + \hat{Y}_{dj}}{Z_a + Z_b + Z_d} \times Z_c \right)$$
 where  $Z_a$ ,  $Z_b$ ,  $Z_c$  and  $Z_d$  are the sizes of strata A, B, C and D respectively.
